I had know the basics of Bitcoin and the Blockchain after reading blogs and other books this year.

It's a good book for someone serious about entering the space. Norman provides an overview of every aspect of the space: mining, trading, ICOs, etc.

My only criticism is that when Norman writes about the economic underpinnings of the market, ie the broad trends contributing to the rise of cryptocurrencies, he could have elaborated more.

The strongest point of the book is a tutorial on how to trade and speculate with cryptocurrencies.

Poorly written. Two stars because I do actually like the description used of blockchain and will refer beginners to that. But much of the other information is overly simplistic and out of date. Disappointed that I spent money on this.

Not a completely useless book but far inferior to the excellent *Cryptoassets: The Innovative Investor's Guide to Bitcoin and Beyond*. Where that book is written with sincerity and an eye towards the long term, this looks more like a quick cash-grab, with parts that seem like they may have been outsourced or written by somebody else.

It gives you brief overviews of the main ways to make money in crypto: investing, trading, mining and ICOs. Some basic, high-level advice is given on what to do and what not to do. Unlike *Cryptoassets* there is nothing you couldn't learn here by just googling around for a bit.

There are parts that are written competetently but also other parts which have numerous spelling and grammatical errors, with some odd word choices and stylistic idiosyncracies that make them stand out from the other content. For example, the author confuses "simple moving averages", a tool used in technical analysis to detect trends in noisy price data, with "dollar cost averaging", which is the practice of investing a set amount at a regular interval to avoid having to time purchases.

He then gets his terms confused even more when he provides a variant of dollar cost averaging that allows for bigger buys in a down market. There is an actual name for this and it's "value averaging". However the author for some reason calls it the "exponential moving average" strategy which is even weirder.

When the book gets to the topic of ICOs it gets quite interesting and I would say it actually provides a lot of very good information. The author has a very cynical perspective on these, recommending you do your due diligence and stating that the majority are scams/worthless and should be taken only for short-term trading opportunities. His advice on trading is generally quite strong as well.

I suspect the weaker parts of the book were outsourced to low-cost freelancers in other countries to ship it out the door as quickly as possible. Not a complete waste but way beneath the standard of the more serious crypto books coming out.
