Say what you will about zombie apocalypses, but I find the idea to be somewhat intriguing. Especially since it's a scenario where you wouldn't truly understand what is happening until it's already too late. But what I enjoy most about Pembroke Sinclair's zombie apocalypse, is the fact that despite there being flesh eating zombies, survival is still highly plausible in this world. I would almost dare to say they are finding survival to be a bit too easy, if I'm being honest, what with it being several years in and they can still find fuel, drive cross country back and forth and clean clothes.

In this sequel, the story picks up right after the ending of *Life After the Undead*. Krista, Quinn and the rest of the inhabitants of North Platte have succeeded in overthrowing Krista's skeezy cousin, Liet, but they know the time has come to leave before the Families in Florida plot an attack. However, as much time as they believe they have, they are astounded when a set of helicopters arrive and blow up the town. After all, their next plan was to figure out how to liberate the people in Florida from the Families. But this show of strength definitely puts a damper on things.

Like every great zombie apocalypse book, the biggest threat to Krista and the people from North Platte is the living, not the dead. After all, the zombies have increasingly become less and less of a threat as their bodies continue to deteriorate. The journey in this book seems to be a fairly short one. After all, the book takes place over the course of a few weeks. However short it may feel, I think the author did a great job at keeping the pacing both quick and smooth. Also, it was nice to see some of the answers to Krista's questions from the previous book, coming to light. After all, isn't it natural to want to know how the world fell into despair or at least the events of what happened in the beginning of the apocalypse.

The only issue I had with this book revolved around the remnants of the world Krista lived in. Sometimes things seemed a bit too convenient for her and the other survivors. For example, it's been three years and a group of survivors who are "supposedly" cut off from those in Florida are drinking coffee and having cookies? While I understand the majority of mankind has been killed or is now the undead, it just didn't seem to make sense that these isolated survivors would have access to such luxuries. Then again, I had a hard time believing Florida still had helicopters that could not only still work, but were able to fly across country and still have enough fuel to get back. So in that aspect, I had to ignore my more logical side and try not to focus too heavily on some of the details. But besides that, I really enjoyed this book and would highly recommend it.

Krista and Quinn continue with their mission to overthrow The Families and to eliminate the zombies. Easier said than done when there are so many obstacles in their way. This picks up right where it left off in book one.

Krista had won the battle against her cousin Liet who is now being held Prisoner in North Platte. Despite her badly injured shoulder, she is still determined to inform others of what's really happening in Florida.

Quinn is working towards the same goal as Krista. They work very well together and make a very good team. Their relationship is also blossoming as young loves.

North Platte is now under threat, not only from the zombies but from the power hungry families in Florida. They decide to go West to another secure location, taking Liet along with them as a prisoner. Is showing compassion for someone with Liet's personality and mentality a wise move? This could prove to be detrimental to their cause. The unexpected happens as soon as they leave North Platte and surprisingly The Families have unimaginable resources.

After they reach their destination, Liet and Krista decide to go and warn the occupants of another safe camp of their discovery. They don't receive the expected response. They soon find out that on top of fighting against the zombies, there are others who want them dead. Liet puts them in an awkward and dangerous situation and Krista finds herself back in Florida as a prisoner. What about Quinn?

Krista finds out how the zombies came to be. The Families are using fear and false sense of security to keep the inhabitants of Florida on their sides. Krista has also been betrayed by someone she trusted with her plans. Knowing who to trust becomes more and more difficult.

This second part is fast paced. There are traitors amongst the midst. There are also allies who are prepared to put their lives on the line in order to overthrow The Families and take back what rightly belongs to them. Getting rid of the zombies and working together instead of against each other?

I really enjoyed reading Death to the Undead. It picks up from where Life After the Undead left off, and I was surprised by how much the characters changed! I really like that, and they all changed in a non-negative way (vice versa to the antagonists). In this book, Krista is even faced with more problems as she's not only fighting with zombies, but with selfish, heartless people. How ugly is that! The Disneyland in Florida is occupied by hundreds of civilians and 5 families who basically rules the place. One of the families, the Johnsons, is lot more superior than the other families and wants all the people in Disneyland to just continue living their life there. They are being fed with false information, and the family twists the words so everyone would feel frightened and prevent them from planning an uprising because, you know, they want to keep all the power and all. I received this book on a read to review basis from NetGalley. Thank you to the author, Pembroke Sinclair, and the publisher, Booktrope, for the opportunity.

I think my enjoyment for this book was marred due to my own stupidity in not realizing this book was the second in a series before beginning it. I didn't feel lost or confused as such, but the book I received was a far cry from the book I expected.

The synopsis of the book described this as a post-apocalyptic novel after hordes of zombies have infested the world. The story follows seventeen-year-old Krista as she attempts to make the world a better place by leading a rebellion against The Families – an organisation that are little better than slavers and terrorists – that have taken advantage of the desiccation of the government and law enforcement agencies and now plan to rule all those left of the dramatically decreased and weakened human race.

I expected more action and more zombies in this zombie novel but instead I found a political revolt that felt a little repetitive in its conception. Instead there often seemed little underlying reasons were given for the repetitive assaults on Krista and her partner Quinn's life. There involved lots of scenes of Krista firing guns in enclosed spaces leading to a preceding and temporary loss of hearing and even more scenes of her falling on her back and hurting her already injured shoulder. They added little to the plot and I felt a lot of pages were spent focusing on the same injuries she continually receives. It also seemed like there were a lot of people who wanted to harm her, leading me to become confused between the myriads of sides presented and their exact reasoning for wanting her dead. The plot, whilst not complex, felt like it was constantly running in circles around itself, but this may well have been due to my not having read the first book in the series.

I felt Krista's character to be inconsistent with her age. She appeared to me to come across as far older and I often wondered how her young age commanded such respect in her followers and such fear in her enemies. She was never questioned and her people came across as one big, unorganised flock that were unable to think and fend for themselves. Quinn's character felt wooden and I would have liked to see a further development of his character.

The book was also a little inconsistent and lacked explanation for the myriad of questions that surfaced whilst reading this. How have so many got access to electricity? Why do we hear so little from the thousands in her side of the rebellion? Why are we given such a limited view of The Families? Why are we told so little about what makes them such evil dictators? Where 'dem zombies at? But, again, reading the first book may have answered all of these.

I feel bad giving this book such a low rating when I feel like it is partially my own fault as the reader but opinions are opinions and, despite my questions, I have no desire to go back and read the first book as I feel like perhaps this series is just not for me.
