Takeo's mother, Yuriko G?da, was a real breath of fresh air for me because, despite the fact that she resembles her super manly son in many ways, she is also a very recognizably good mother - plus she's pregnant - juxtapositioning manly and feminine in playful easy going ways. In contrast to Yuriko we also meet Makoto Sunakawa's father who has apparently always been a very gentleman who is also very fragile and sickly.

And while Takeo and Yamato's relationship is still overflowing with naive new relationship energy Kawahara effortlessly (obviously) manages to keep my own person cynicism in check. This is certainly not because Takeo and Yamato somehow manage to avoid every single romantic cliche and trope, but rather because Kawahara has them make mistakes and then has them learn from them in a way that (at least for me) did not come across as overly preachy. They are still very flawed characters, while still managing to be super fluffy and the overly dramatic poses that Aruka keeps drawing Takeo in are hilarious.

Second volume of maybe the most adorable shoji/romance manga I have read so far (which is not THAT much, but this one stands out for me). We have three central characters, Takeo, a 6'6", 265 pound guy who is all heart but not a likely romantic lead. He intervenes on behalf of (petite) Yamato who is being bothered by some guy on a train; she makes him a dessert to thank him, and she begins to like him. Takeo assumes she would prefer his typically gorgeous best friend, Sunakawa, but nope, Takeo and Yamato fall surprisingly in love, which creates some occasions for sweetness and comedy.

In this volume two roadblocks in their budding relationship occur; 1) Takeo has to be gone for a sumo wrestling tournament for a month, and 2) after planning a birthday for Yamato, Takeo has to be at Sunakawa's side as his dad has emergency surgery. You may wonder whether they weather these storms, but there ARE multiple volumes of this series. The relationships between each couple and between all three of them are sweet and fun, and there is some growing interest in just what might be the object of Sunakawa's affections.
