Big brother Charlie guides little sister Lola through rules numbers as they trek to the store, where their mom has promised them one toy each. Younger readers will enjoy correcting Lola’s miscountings, while older readers can join Charlie in calculating simple math problems that arise during the journey — such as, how many stickers does Lola have left after sticking five on the pavement, three on a tree, two on her shoes, one

on her brother and one on the dog? (Answer: zero.) Though the pages are chock full of numbers, the sibling humor, well-paced plot and funky illustrations make for a breezy read.

Lauren Child's ever present humour permeates this delightful story of Charlie and his little sister Lola who are allowed to choose one thing each at the shops. The different mathematical conceptual understanding between the ages is brilliantly portrayed and numbers are explored with some complexity.
