When I finished her debut novel, Home, I commented that this was a writer to watch in the future and her second novel offered up more of the same wonderful writing as the first book in her Glenview series. I was thrilled when I was given an ARC to read and am so happy to report that it is every bit as good as the first in the series. Perhaps even better!

Broken Home finds the same cast of characters from Home living in the small town of Glenview, Iowa and allows the reader the chance to explore a deeper look into the lives of some of the folks that we were introduced to in the first book. What a delightful thing to be able to pick up right where the last book left off knowing a bit about the history of the people and adding new ones into the mix. However it is not necessary to have read the first book before reading this one as they can both totally stand on their own.

This book focuses on Charlotte and David and as the story develops the reader is drawn into the various twists and turns in their relationship and sees the past of both of the characters dredge up old fears and insecurities. To understand Charlotte and David the reader has to understand where each of them has come from and why they react the way that they do to one another and to different situations. Rachel Smith is a consummate storyteller and with each page turn the reader is drawn in and is pulled into the lives of those small town folks in Glenview.

One thing that I love about this writer is her ability to really throw the reader a few curves along the way. Yes, it is a romance but it is also a mystery, a whodunit, and an inspirational story all wrapped up in one neat package. Just when I thought I knew what the next page would bring to Charlotte and David I was surprised. Unpredictable and well written, Broken Home, offers far more than the average boy meets girl love story. It evokes real feelings from the reader time and time again.

Home is once again a destination that each character appears to be attempting to reach despite the obstacles in their path. It is clear that each character has their own definition of home and is trying to get there however they can. The fortunate ones make it. The less fortunate ones can only dream about it.

3.75 stars! It starts off with a fatal car accident that caught my attention and emotion. Charlotte loses everything in one moment. Her husband and son are killed. She has to continue living without them, but soon after mysterious numbers call her phone, even when she changes her cell/mobile phones. I read quite a few romantic suspense novels, so I was looking for what makes this one different.

She heads to a small town as just one place to hide temporarily. The text messages and phone numbers keep coming. However, in this town she makes a friend with Melissa and Lily (even though the two have a strained relationship) and meets David. He is messed up since his girlfriend cheated on him and his mother left his father and him when he was young. I liked that he had a decent backstory as to his drinking and sleeping around in the beginning.

As the story continues, I wasn't as fond of Charlotte and David and their bickering. Some of it seemed a bit childish, but they were coming from painful backgrounds. Charlotte had found out her husband was in over his head with gambling debts, and that the car accident was not an accident.

The story picked up for me about halfway through. The events pick up speed as Charlotte isn't sure who to trust as more info is revealed. Then David has to decide what he is willing to do. I enjoyed the second half of the story more than the first.

There are sex scenes where Charlotte and David sizzle. There is some violence. What I think is that the secondary characters could have been developed a bit more, so that the side stories with David and his dad and the surprise twist, and Melissa's reason for being angry and messed up as she tries to befriend Charlotte could have added to it. The ending wrapped a bit quicker with less detail about Jared and the rescue than I would have liked. The epilogue was wonderful.

I hope that Lizzie, Melissa, Evan, and a couple more characters should have their own chance to a happily ever after.
