Beautiful story of the aftermath of the French Revolution and the lives of emigres in England. The Morland family seems to be without a next generation as Jemima surveys her offspring. Who will inherit the estates that her husband recovered for her? Half of her family seems to want to travel the high seas fighting General Napoleon while the other half seems unwilling to marry & produce offspring. Often heartrending.

Jane Irish Nelson says

Probably 3.5 stars. This series was designed to be a pageant of English history, as it impacted one particular family. However, the drawback is that at times their personal affairs overwhelm the historical narrative. This book takes place over about five years, covering the final years of the 18th century and the dawn of the 19th. England is at war with France, a war that seems never-ending. But this is good news for those members of the Morland family in the navy, as it provides them with employment. The lives of the extended Morland family play out against this backdrop, with births, deaths, marriages — and affairs. Jemima finally has the grandchildren she wished for, to provide an heir for Morland Place, but she worries about some of her children's marriages. In addition, she finds herself increasingly perplexed by some of their actions. Will any of them ever find peace and happiness?
