From the moment I picked up *Two-Faced* I was hooked! I'm so happy that I read this book after *Rebel Belle* because I was really looking for a good fantasy after it. To say this book was good is an understatement! I read this book in about two hours and wish it had been longer.

I'm so used to reading fantasies that are 400 pages long, and reading one that was about half the size left me kind of disappointed. I just feel that if the book were a bit longer, we might have gotten more character development and seen more into Zander's life. I really would have liked seeing some more flashbacks in Skyler's life of her time before becoming an assassin. I also would have liked seeing more of Zander's life with his family and seen a little more of the royal politics. We were always told that he talked with his mother and it wasn't pleasant, but I'd have liked seeing, or at least hearing about the conversations more. With a longer book, I think we could have seen that. I also would have liked to see more of Zander with his sister and his friend/guard Jacob. All of that aside, I really liked *Two-Faced* for the elements it had.

I really liked Skyler as a main character for her sass and overall, because she wasn't whiny!! Skyler didn't put up with shit, but she didn't whine when shit hit the fan either. She also didn't let things from her past get in the way of her current job which wasn't either bad or good. At the same time, she wasn't so closed off that Zander and Emily--her friend--couldn't get to her.

I loved how Davenport included flashbacks of Skyler's life before becoming an assassin as it allowed me to connect with her more and sympathize with her situation. It also helped me understand *why* she chose to be

Two-Faced by Nia Davenport is a fun little novel that I read in about two hours. It follows Skyler, a teenage assassin whom has been contracted to kill the crowned prince. In order to get close to her target Skyler poses as a member of the lesser nobility and enters into a competition for the prince's hand in marriage. Skyler fully intends to complete her contract until she meets the prince and discovers that he is much more than she expected. When she begins to fall in love with the prince she must make the decision whether or not to come clean about whom she truly is. Not to mention save the prince who has a price on his head.

The story takes place in a medieval world with a modern twist. While the world itself is full of castles, nobles, horses and swords, the characters have a more modern-day mindset. Skyler is a fully functioning young woman who knows who she is, what she wants, and what she's good at. She doesn't take anything from anyone and she stands up for what she believes in. The prince is an open-minded fellow who appreciates the traits that make Skyler different from other girls. Skyler and the prince share common ideas on the realm that tend to differ from the norm for their kingdom. Their relationship is based on mutual attraction but also more on personality than looks or fortune.

The romance between Skyler and the prince was fun and flirty. I enjoyed both characters and I thought their personalities went well together. I could buy that they would be attracted to each other from the start and I liked seeing them get to know each other and let their guards down. I think that perhaps the romance developed a little too quickly, but then again the book itself was pretty short, so it fit with the length of the story.

Story-wise, I liked the world and the action. Skyler is a kick-ass girl who knows how to handle herself. She doesn't back down and she stands up for her friends. I enjoyed every time she stood up to the nobility or put herself in danger to save the prince and his family. Unfortunately, I felt that the story moved along at far too quick of a pace. Everything about the book, from the main plot-line to the romance, seemed rushed. The writing was decent and the characters were well fleshed out but I think the book could have been twice as long as it was. Each plot point was reached and overcome very quickly. If more time had been spent building up to the romance and to the climax than I think the book would have been better for it.

Overall, I liked this book. If you're looking for a sweet teen romance first and foremost, try this one. If you're looking more for court intrigue and politics, this is probably not for you.
