Although each of the 5 stories can be read and purchased as standalones I personally enjoy them more when I read all 5 of them because the stories and characters are connected in some way.

The themes are ones that you've heard of before but the stories themselves are not cliches but rather original. My less than 5 star ratings are the stories with which I had tiny issues but still very much enjoyed. This collection is very much chick lit but relatable. You will feel the character's emotions and be happy that they found their HEA. Be prepared to laugh, smile, swoon, and tear up.

Beach Flirts are perfect for the summertime! If you are in a reading slump or need a quick lighthearted read that will keep you invested 'til the end, I recommend Lisa Scott's collections. If you generally don't like shorts I recommend sampling her writing first.
