I already read a children's and adult books for my little Christmas marathon, so as the third and final one I decided to pick something from middle grade/YA genre. I admit that I don't know much about Krampus night or the celebrations around it, because we don't have such holiday here, so I was really curious to pick up this book.

And it was a great surprise! A fantastic, holiday themed adventure story, focusing on a fight between light and dark (or snow and coals here :)).
