I hate to say it but not all books work for every reader. That's not to say they are bad books, but they just don't work with a certain reader. SEAL's Promise was that kind of book for me. If I'm honest, I just couldn't get into this book or its characters. I didn't feel a romantic connection between Shannon and Frankie or TJ and Shannon. Everything happened at super-speed at the start of the book and then kind of dragged through the middle and end. I had to stop and start several times and almost DNF this a couple of times.

The story is about Frankie, TJ's best friend and SEAL team partner, marrying Shannon. He ends up KIA, which honestly did bring tears to my eyes. That part was well written and beautiful. Then very quickly TJ becomes someone different and immediately falls for Shannon. They fall together and then fall apart quickly which leads to some more drama. Shannon also drove me to distraction. It's fine if you're going to move on so quickly after a spouse's death, but make up your mind. You are a grown woman who doesn't need other people making decisions for you. There was also a secondary terrorism plot thrown in that seemed mostly unrealistic, although it did give the opportunity to show growth and depth for TJ's character. Overall I just couldn't connect and stay devoted to the storyline much of the time.

SEAL romance is my favorite kind of romance. I just love when these big, bad boys fall hard. It is a wonder to see them come to terms with that side of their personalities. In this romance, we get a lot in the way of people coming to terms with things they never expected. As this is #8 in a series, you should know that you don't need to read the others if you get this one. These SEALS are friends, but previous plots don't play a part in this story. This book is primarily a romance but it has a suspense plot that kicks in about 80% through.

Shannon and T.J. have a hate you on first sight relationship. Although, T.J. really didn't hate Shannon, he just enjoyed annoying the hell out of her. Shannon married T.J.'s best friend, Frankie. Frankie is killed in action and leaves Shannon a 6 month pregnant widow. Frankie also made T.J. promise to take care of her and the baby.
