Nathaniel Frederickson, a Bow Street Runner, is asked to investigate a series of thefts: artefacts belonging to the Earl of Brodford have been disappearing. Nate will be living at Lord Brodford's country estate, far away from the London society, which he purposefully eschews. Nate enjoys all the perks of the aristocracy, as he lives with his half-brother the Duke of Wesbrook, who knows nothing of his life as a Runner.

Nate will also have to double as a bodyguard for Brodford's niece, 21 year-old Lady Annabel Baines. Nate detests the aristocracy, being the neglected bastard son of a Duke, who ignored him. Nate's previous meetings with aristocrats have been unpleasant and reminded him too much of his father's behaviour, but Lord Brodford appears different. Annabel intends to continue running the school her late mother left her, however there are some problems that need taking care of, and Nate is in her way. Annabel does not like having a watchdog, she tries to lose him, even though she does find him very handsome, but it's pointless, Nate will not leave Annabel's side.

Nate is very judgemental, he is blinded by his father's attitude towards him, while Annabel is not; she dislikes people based on their actions, not their title, and Nate makes things very difficult. He even surprises himself at how defensive he's acting towards Annabel; she unsettles him, she's not acting the way he expects, and he also finds her quite appealing. Annabel is known as a wallflower, and she is rather proud of this state of affairs, but she's also ingenious, resourceful, and stubborn, but in an entirely believable way. Nate is a dedicated professional, but he is blinded by his dislike of the aristocracy, and it clouds his judgement when it comes to Annabel, among other things.

I loved the beginning of *THE RUNNERS'S ENTICEMENT*; we are given a good idea of Nate's job as a Bow Street Runner, and of the man himself. I sometimes find this trope of enemies to lovers trying, however the confrontational banter between Nate and Annabel is very entertaining, because they are quite adept when it comes to using words as weapons. It was rather obvious where the whole thing was going, but Ms. Ryleigh's writing made all the difference. Both Annabel and Nate are intriguing characters, and their interactions were very interesting. *THE RUNNER'S ENTICEMENT* is very fast-paced at the beginning, but unfortunately after a while things begin to drag on quite a bit; the plot could have been tightened a tad. However the prose is clever and witty, and the dialogues are exceptionally well done, as are the sex scenes. Although it does make references to the first book, *THE RUNNER'S ENTICEMENT* can easily be read as a standalone. I hope we get to learn more about Nate's friend, the earl of Foxmoore, because he's quite fascinating.

Nate has his own views of the aristocracy and he holds those views close to his heart. He then meets Lady Annabel. She throws all that he expects of the aristocracy out the window with her views of the world around her. She looks at people based on their actions not on their birth, rank, or social standing. None of what she does meets with the expectations that Nate has while living in her uncle's home.

I found the interaction between Nate and Annabel to be entertaining and a bit predictable. I enjoyed their clash of wills and the strong nature of Annabel. She was more. While not making it seem all about her. There was a big pull in the beginning. I then felt like I was being dragged to the end. I would like to give this another try after reading the first book in the series. I want more information.
