I really enjoyed Chasing Claire over Raine Falling. Ms. Marinaro did a better job with editing, more story development, and didn't over do the steamy scenes.

Claire has demons to face from her past and recent choices- which really, these were choices she should never have had to make. She's in love with Reno, but she's also a runner. She needs to let go of her fears, open up to Reno - once and for all, and plant her feet firmly in one place with the man who can ground her for life.

Also, there's a side story glimpse at something possible with Dolly, Reno's mom, and Gianni, a head crime boss of his family. I'm definitely hopeful for their own book.

While all of this is going on, Claire makes a big life choice for her future, while some crazy bad people try to take away Reno and Dolly's future altogether.

In the end, everyone needs to band together, sort their junk out, and realize what they have and fight for it. Or maybe that's just Reno - as life flashing before your eyes can do that to a person.

I absolutely loved Raine Falling and was a little scared about Chasing Claire because Claire was such a wild card with her past and addictions. I have to say that I was pleasantly surprised by the direction Marinaro took in this story. Claire put on her big girl panties and took control of her life. Although Claire was still reeling from the violent events that occurred in Raine Falling, she is trying to find a semblance of normal for her life. And surprisingly, Reno, the sexy biker who she has a love/hate relationship with, helps her to find that normal. Reno and Claire begin Chasing Claire in a really ugly place. Like him being balls deep in another woman, ugly. Although the situation that drove him to that point was feeling rejected by Claire, she is no less than hurt. The couple lash out at one another with barbs and insults and a bigger wedge is driven between them because neither of them is willing to be open about how they feel. But a moment of serendipity occurs when Claire's n-used truck, a gift from her brother-in-law Diego breaks down and she needs a ride to her first day of college. Claire calls the MC clubhouse hoping that one of the biker brethren can give her a ride. But guess who answers the call? Good ole Reno. Reno takes Claire to school and is actually so sweet, giving her a pep talk and encouragement. He even waits around to make sure she gets around alright. And one sweet, but not so selfless, gesture by Reno provide he and Claire with a bit of a detente. I mention Reno's *not so selflessness* because although HE IS helping her by taking her to and from school, he loves her and he wants her in his life. He uses their time together to woo her in his gruff and sexy biker way. I love the push/pull relationship between the couple and Claire's ability to give as good as she got. She is definitely woman enough for Reno and doesn't let him steamroll over her.

As Reno and Claire settle into a revitalized relationship -- one that is VERY hot a heavy -- some of demons from Claire's past come back to haunt them and almost ends up costing Reno...BIG TIME. *I'm intentionally being vague because I don't want to ruin the story for future readers.* There are so many **BIG** moments in this story between Reno and Claire and an epic one with Reno and his mother, Dolly, while they are visiting his father's graveside. The moment with Reno and his mother changes everything. I both loved it and hated it because it left me sitting on the edge of my seat. Fortunately, that is not where Marinaro left us. 3.25 RATING-I read Chasing Claire months ago but didn't sit down to do a review until now. I guess I was a bit hesitant. I really liked the first book in the Hell Saints Motorcycle Club series, Raine Falling, and was looking forward to this one so much. Unfortunately, it fell flat.

The main complaint I have is that the author did a lot of "telling" and not a lot of "doing". There were a lot of long monologues which made for a bit of a boring read. I was actually surprised by this because Raine Falling kept me hooked from beginning to end. Three stars is a very generous rating for a book that, within the first few pages, set up a scene that was so nauseating that I was prepared for a big, fat, rant. The only reason this is getting an average rating for me is because of the other characters and plot lines that made up for the mediocre and frustrating H and h of this story.

Let's get back to the first volume in this biker romance series of the Hells Saints Motorcycle Club in which we meet the h, Claire Winston. In *Raine Falling*, Claire Winston first makes her appearance as the strung-out, druggie sister of the main character Raine Winston. Because of her reckless actions and that of her unscrupulous boyfriend, Raine ends up off the straight path she had been struggling to keep herself on and involved in the outlaw biker life, something she had tried to avoid at all costs. I was prepared to dislike Claire but as we find out more about the background of the Winston sisters, she evoked my sympathy.

Claire disappears for most of *Raine Falling* as she is in a 28 day rehab program, from which she emerges successfully sober. On the day that her sister picks her up from rehab, she meets Reno, a foot soldier in the Hells Saints Motorcycle Club, who is there to give a ride and his protection to the sisters. Reno naturally has Bad Boy written all over him and Claire, to her credit, immediately fights her attraction to him because she is terrified to fall back into the pattern of bad men and bad decisions that have wrecked her life so far.

Claire stood behind me frozen and Reno just stared at her. This was going well.

"Nice to meet you," my sister said softly from behind me.

"Likewise." Reno was looking at my sister like she was something to eat.

Claire is a smart and beautiful if vulnerable and damaged girl who wants to start fresh and make something out of her life. She had my admiration for that. So Claire and Reno dance around their attraction for most of *Raine Falling*, leading to this very sweet scene between them, as they are both on a ladder trying to hang up lights for an upcoming party:

As soon as Claire worked her way to the top of the tall stepladder, Reno was on it right behind her. Very close behind her. His hard chest and long muscled thighs pushing against her back and her ass. His arms outstretched, biceps bulging reaching past her long, thin, graceful ones.

"I got it," Reno said against Claire's ear.

Claire went very still. When she pulled her arm away, Reno caught the string of lights before they fell and reached past her to string them precisely where he knew Claire wanted them.

"Reno," Claire whispered.

"Claire," Reno whispered back.

Then he put his hands on either side of her waist.

"Step back, Reno."

"Not this time, Claire," Reno said against her ear.

"This ladder is unsteady. I'm afraid." Claire said breathlessly.

"My arms are here, baby. Tight around you. You take a minute and feel that. Feel how strong I am. Ain't gonna let nothing happen to you, Claire. You're safe with me. I fucking swear it."

It took a moment, but Claire relaxed into him. With his hands still on her waist, Reno gently guided her down.

Swwwwwoooooonnnnn. I could tell these two characters were going to get a story of their own and after that sweet, sweet scene, I was anticipating a great read. But I was even more excited by Claire's character development towards the end of *Raine Falling*. Not to spoil plot points, but she showed a spine of steel in a very dangerous situation. And she stood up to her sister's man, a big bad-ass of a man, with sass and strength. Again, for fear of spoilers, I don't want to paste that speech here but it was EPIC.

Based on all of this, I was so, so disappointed in the turn of events that occurred in *Chasing Claire*. It was like Claire was a completely different character. From a spine of steel to spineless. From a strong woman to a weak one who lets her traitorous body humiliate her. And Reno was a complete, big, fat jerk. In the very first few pages of the book, Claire walks in on him about to bed a "club whore." Now Claire and Reno were not exactly dating. Their relationship was not conventional but there was something between them. So, in my opinion, this was a betrayal. But what does Claire do? She lets Reno get up from the bed where he was about to penetrate a very naked red-headed stripper, trap her against the wall, and put his hand down her pants. Her traitorous body then orgasms, just fifteen feet away from the other woman who is by the way still naked waiting in the bed and has a front row seat to the sex show. Then the other woman propositions Claire and Reno for a threesome.

What did I tell you? Nauseating.

Things did not improve from there onwards. Claire did not ever regain the spunk and attitude that had me interested in her story in the previous volume. Reno did not even come close to justifying his whorish ways and never really apologized for his horrible behavior, behavior that if Claire had engaged in, she would have been branded as a "slut" or "whore" by these bikers. Yes, I know I don't read biker romances for their kittens and unicorns sugary sweet romances and their politically correct male characters. But. Come. On.

Another disturbing thing was the amount of alcohol and "pain killers" Claire takes throughout the book. Now, I know she did her rehab and she was clean of the harder drugs that precipitated her downfall in the previous book, but there is no mention made at all about any struggle to overcome urges and fall back into

addictive behaviors. Nor is she or any of her family and friends who love and support her at all bothered by the fact that she imbibes alcohol or pops pills on a pretty regular basis. She has no sponsor nor does she go to therapy. This part was very implausible to me.

The only reason this gets three stars is because of the supporting cast of characters. I still believe that Paula Marinaro has put out one of the better written biker series out there. She has created a multi-dimensional world in her Hells Saints Motorcycle Clubs and taken quite a bit of time developing a multitude of characters. I like the fact that she focuses on different generations of the biker club. We have Prosper, the patriarch, his wife Pinky and her best friend Dolly. We have the major players of the club along with their old ladies and/or love interests. A B plot surrounding Glory, a friend of the club, Jules, the Viking-like medic of the biker club, and Glory's brother, a decorated Marine and badass in his own right named, of all things, Hallelujah, was riveting. There is even the appearance of a group of Italian mobsters who play an unusual role in the story. I know Jules and Glory's story is coming up and once again, I know I am going to be sucked right back into the world of the Hells Saints, despite this lackluster volume in the series.

The first book in This series(I read the original version and the edited version) was one of my all time favorite MC books, what the author was able to create not only with the story but the characters and their relationships was magical so of course I was ecstatic and impatiently waiting for Chasing Claire. Woe Is Me

In book one, the *woes* were real, palpable off the pages, and nothing was forced. I empathized with the characters and wanted them to solve their problems.

In this book, the *woe* of 'I killed them'... 'I'm so f'ing horrible'... OVER AND OVER for 12-13 chapters just wasn't believable. It's nothing but repetitively forced angst and woe.

Dickwad, Literally

The first book involved the MC's meeting and Diego screwing a girl thereafter, but in that case, the MCs had not screwed and DID NOT have a relationship yet. The characters kissed other characters during the outs of the relationship, but neither screwed anyone else.

In book two, the MCs have had a relationship for some time & have screwed for days at a time with some kind of push and pull standing in the way of making it official. They have an out. He screws around a lot. He comes back and jumps in bed with a club ho. Female MC walks in on him screwing ho. Male MC gets up and pins female MC to wall and finger fucks her {willingly} with ho still in his bed. He then offers her a threesome because he's pissed at her. I don't mind the dirty, gritty shit of Mclubs, but I don't want to read cheating shit nor MCs literally having their cock in one chick and two seconds later trying to stick it in the

female MC that he supposedly "loves."

Story, What Story?

At 44%, literally nothing has happened. It's he loves me, he loves me not angst with no communication ; everyday school and work shit; and diatribe dribble about mundane shit that NO ONE CARES ABOUT! The most interesting thing to happen by 46% of the book is a fight between Jules and Glory, supporting characters mind you, that takes up an entire chapter. Earth to author, earth to author... When a fight over Rice-A-Roni and mobsters between secondary characters take up an entire chapter in your book, YOUVE GOT A LAME ASS STORY WITH YOUR MAIN CHARACTERS and should regroup vs using fill-in sub character drama. By the end, the only thing with any substance at all to happen was a shooting and an engagement.

NOT A Standalone

This is far from a standalone. No wedding with the MCs . Glory's f'd up shit and her brother are left hanging. Dolly and her weird relationship is hinted to, but then never mentioned again. It's alluded that some shady shit might be going in with Crow and Raine, but that two is just never mentioned again.

MCs That Didn't Spark

POV Structure Clusterfuck
