If you are overly sensitive to horrific editing, poor grammar and immature word choices this is not the book for you. If you are easily frustrated by a fixation that borders on obsession with immaterial details that detract from what could be a much more intriguing story, this is not the book for you.

This author has created an interesting, fairly unique world with an overarching plot that is interesting but fails to develop characters to the point you honestly don't care about any of them. His fixation on a poorly developed magic system that attempts to explain what appears to be the Vancian spell-casting system without actually referencing it is not only annoying but utterly distracting. It is not well thought out and bases itself on principles and concepts that are never explained, yet the author spends page upon page explaining how the protagonist accomplishes his magical feats.

His time would be better spent on character development and enriching his descriptions of his world. There

are glimmers of hope within the pages that point to the possibility of a much richer tale but as it sits he has taken 3 books to write what could have fit into 1 if he'd stop focusing on how magic cores link together, wasted words which do not add anything to the tale at all.

Despite all this, the plot and world is interesting enough to continue this series to its bitter end, if only because there are far too few good choices available today.
