I think I enjoyed Enchanted a little more than Enthroned, the first novel in this series, though the pace was a bit slower; the ending wasn't as abrupt, and the fact you already knew the characters/world left more space to get to know Britt and Merlin better.

The plot of Enchanted deals with Morgause (King Lot's wife) and her sons visiting Camelot.
