Vengeful murderous spirits are released when the local entrepreneur decides to reopen the century old mill which made his family their fortune (thanks to exploitative child labour of the times).

Carolyn is married to Philip Sturgess, head of a rich and once-influential family that has resided in the small town of Westover Massachusetts for generations. Carolyn has a kind and sensitive 11-year-old daughter, Beth from a previous marriage and Philip has a rotten-to-the-core 13-year-old daughter Tracy from his first marriage. Tracy (along with her snobby grandmother Abigail Sturgess) hates Beth and Carolyn with a passion and wants nothing more than to see the back of them. Their base reason is that they are “common” and in a lower class to the Sturgess clan. Thankfully Philip isn’t stuck up like his vile mother who lives in the past, or his daughter who was raised and spoilt by Abigail (inheriting her prejudices and then some). Philip just wants everyone to get along! He has even hired architect/builder Alan Rogers, Carolyn’s ex husband, to work on converting the old mill into a shopping complex... Just a shame about the ghosts of the child workers who died in a fire at the mill over a hundred years ago, who would rather the building remained closed...

The theme of family, their secrets and their struggles, feature heavily in this story with the ghosts generally taking a backseat.

Not so much scary but had its shocking moments; Hellfire was an entertaining read. I personally found the first half of the book a bit slow action wise but after that, things picked up and got more disturbing before reaching a horrifying finale/ confrontation between the two main characters. I didn’t see that coming at all so good job Saul, for leaving me dumbstruck!

Unfortunately all of the main characters fell into the category of good or evil, with no in-between to give them more depth, and although it’s not the worse epilogue I’ve read lately, the story would have been much better without that daft ending.

This is my first John Saul novel and hopefully not my last. I’m just not sure whether to go for one of his earlier stories again or something more current.
