Marin Thomas brings us the 3rd installment in the Cash Brothers series. This contemporary romance is set in Arizona and introduces us to Willie Nelson Cash and Marsha Bugler who knew each other briefly in high school, but haven't seen or had contact in over 14 years. Sparks are certainly about to fly.

Marsha received a prestigious scholarship to a college in California and left Arizona right after her high school graduation. After hearing that her father has elected to stop treatments for his prostate cancer she has decided to come home for the summer to spend time with her family. She usually comes home for two weeks, but this year she will stay for 12 weeks. Secrets having a way of coming out and sometimes no one has a way of stopping them. When Marsha left home she had a secret buried in her heart and hasn't shared it with anyone, but knows when she returns home it's time she tells it.

During high school she had a crush on Willie Cash, a well known local bad boy. Being the daughter of a preacher she knows that their going to the prom will shock quiet a few people. As things progress that night

she gives into her one desire of being with Willie, unfortunately there are consequences. When she tells him she's pregnant he's not ready to be a father and wants her to have an abortion, but with her religious background she finds herself unable to do this so instead she moves to California. She has never revealed the name of the father of her child and everyone assumes that Ryan's father is from California. Ryan is now 14 and with every year that passes the resemblance to his father only increases. Now that she is coming home for the summer she knows that everyone will instantly recognize who the father is so she must reveal her secret.

Willie Cash works in construction at the family business. He and his siblings were raised by their grandmother Ada after his mother proved to be unfit and became the talk of the town for her wild ways. I fell in love with this former bad boy and started cheering for him almost immediately. It seems he's almost like a Timex, he takes a licking but keeps on ticking. When confronted with the fact he has a 14 year old son the emotions he goes through, from guilt to anger to shame, just grabs you by the heart. Willie wants to step up and be a father to his son, but there are obstacles he must overcome.

Can Marsha help Willie and Ryan forge a father son relationship or will the obstacles be too great? Can Willie forgive Marsha for not telling him about his son for 14 years? This is a wonderful story and I would recommend it to anyone who loves a good romance.

This is the first I've read of the series but it was easy enough to work out who the others were and how they fitted together. The writing quality was excellent, it's just the actual story line that didn't suit me. It was adequate, perfectly plotted and put together, but lacked the passion and drama I need.

Returning home she knows that there is a possibility that she may run into the father of her child, though she hopes that won't happen as he doesn't

even know he is the father. Marsha left her hometown when she was young and raised the child by herself while going to school. She is now a successful professor. Will Cash is surprised to see Marsha in town again, even more surprised when he realizes that they have a child together. How goes he bond with a super smart kid that isn't interested in hunting and fishing. Marsha and Will realize that there is still an intense attraction between the two of them. But her father's illness and dislike of Will make things hard for the two of them. So...over all I thought the story was good. This is my favorite Cash Brothers book so far - they just keep getting better. There is so much going on, most of it dealing with expectations met and unmet. Marsha had had a huge crush on Will when they were in high school. But as the preacher's daughter, going out with one of the wild Cash brothers was not possible, until she talked Will's brother into convincing him to take her to the prom. That night she put the moves on him and ended up getting pregnant. But Will wasn't ready to be a father so she left Stagecoach to go to college, not telling him that she planned to keep the baby. When she needs to return to Stagecoach because of her father's health, she knows she has to tell Will the truth. To say that he's shocked is putting it mildly. When he compares his life to hers he's not too sure that he has anything to give them, but he wants to try.

I felt so bad for Will. He had never forgotten Marsha and was stunned to get her letter telling him about Ryan and that they were going to be in Stagecoach for the summer. He is determined to get to know his son and try to be a father to him. He remembers the terrible feeling of being rejected by his own father and never wants his son to feel that way. His initial meeting with her just emphasizes their differences and he feels terribly inadequate. Meeting his son only makes it worse. Ryan is incredibly smart and is a bookworm. Will was diagnosed with dyslexia in third grade and barely graduated from high school. He has learned to adapt the way he does things but fears that Ryan will be ashamed of him. Meanwhile, Ryan thinks that Will doesn't like him because Ryan doesn't like rodeos and building things. Will also has to deal with Marsha's dad's disapproval of him making it even harder for him. I loved the way that Marsha stepped in and sent Ryan to spend a weekend with Will without his ereader, expecting that they would have to find a way to communicate. It was great to see them start to bond over a shared interest in the way things work. It was even more moving to see the way that Ryan deduced Will's reading problems and how much he wanted to help his father. Will also found that his feelings for Marsha were growing as they began to get reacquainted. The attraction was still there but he discovered that he wanted more than that. His problem was trying to get past the feeling that he wasn't good enough for her. Just when he thought that he might be making some progress she would pull back because of her father's attitude. This left him feeling worse than ever. I really

liked the advice that Johnny gave him and that Will was willing to follow it. The ending was spectacular.

Marsha had been a good girl all through school, fully aware of what was expected of her as the preacher's daughter. Her one rebellion was the crush she had on Will. I loved the way she got Buck to set up their prom date and then went after what she wanted from him. It was just her luck that she ended up pregnant. She told Will, but wasn't really surprised by his reaction. She didn't tell her parents before she left for college, determined that she would keep the baby and prove to them that she could handle it all. She didn't tell them until after Ryan was born, and didn't tell them who the father was. Over the next fourteen years she didn't forget Will, but was very careful that he didn't find out about Ryan. When her dad got cancer she took Ryan and went back to Stagecoach, determined to finally tell Will about Ryan so they could get to know each other. She also had to confess to her parents about who Ryan's father was. I have to say that for a preacher who was supposed to be all about God's love, her dad was horribly judgmental, especially considering he didn't really know Will at all. It also bothered me that Marsha didn't do more standing up to him in defense of Will. She spent an awful lot of time putting her dad's feelings first. I did like the way that she was determined that Will and Ryan would spend time together. She was really frustrated by the way that Ryan behaved around Will. I loved the way that she forced him into it at first and then made it easy for them to spend time together once they had connected. Marsha also had her own feelings that she had to come to terms with. Now that she had done it, she felt very guilty for not telling Will sooner that she had kept Ryan. She also knew that she was falling for him all over again. She really wanted to be with Will, but she kept letting her father's attitude come between them. Marsha Bugler, the daughter of Stagecoach, Arizona's preacher, finds herself completely alone after she discovers she is pregnant by her high school crush and local bad boy, Willie Nelson Cash. When she tells the eighteen year old about her predicament, Will tells Marsha that he cannot be a father and to "take care" of it. So Marsha goes away to California and unbeknownst to most of Stagecoach, she gives birth to a son who she raises on her own while she puts herself through a grueling school schedule to somehow make the parents, who she let down, proud of her.

Fourteen years later, Marsha has a Ph.D. and a son who is as smart as a whip. Ryan has grown up without a father. Marsha decided that after Will Cash's reaction to her pregnancy that she would keep her son, Ryan's existence from most parties involved until a chance meeting with a Cash brother, and a terminal cancer diagnosis for her father, makes her decision no longer viable. So she sends off a letter to Will explaining about their now fourteen year old son.

When Will finds out he has a son, a multitude of emotions and questions spark to life. How could Marsha keep his son from him for all this time? Will struggles with the fact that his own father cast him aside and feels he has no business being a role model to a child, especially since Will has nothing of his own but a truck and the clothes on his back. Will was never a "student" but he got by however he possibly could. What's a guy with dyslexia supposed to do when he couldn't possibly have the grandparents who were taking care of his five siblings and himself pay for special lessons for him? So instead, Will just skated by and survived, but not enough to have the preacher's daughter overlook his shortcomings... Or could she?

Once Marsha is back in town and Ryan has a chance to meet his father, so many feelings that were pushed aside and never addressed spill out causing quite the time of it for all involved.
