I deliberately took my time reading this, savoring the atmosphere. Like Dizzy Walker, I am a Disney-phile; my first visit was in 1955, opening year, though not on opening day. I was nine. The last time I visited was in 2003, when I was 57. I have lost very little of the wide-eyed wonder of my childhood self, though I have to rely on a motorized scooter now instead of running around on my own two feet.

Disneyland (Anaheim) is still one of my favorite places on Earth.

I plan on keeping this on my Kindle Fire and re-reading it frequently. Thank you, Matt Ainsworth, from the child that lives in each of us.

There were some continuity/editing problems. Dizzy's mom, Michelle, is referred to as "Megan" a few times, and Travis' mom, Linda, was called "Michelle" once. Commas were omitted, especially before names, and several times homophones ("sound-alike" words) were used in place of the proper word(s).

There were some typos but they weren't too distracting. Sometimes the details slowed things down, and I personally thought Dizzy was a strange name for a main character and expected it to mean something more at the end since Dizzy is so close to Disney. I liked that the clues made sense logically and were solved by children--It didn't make me feel like a complete idiot (like with David Vinci Code and its chronology).
