The newest book in this very entertaining and imaginative science fiction series about aliens who raffle off a certain number of humans once a year, all perfectly legal in exchange for saving humankind from an awful disease, had me very excited to see what Jana Downs has come up with now. And it was so worth it! This is a story about the importance of communication, and not just the linguistic part. With instant translations due to cerebral implants, that has only been an issue where the languages were so incompatible that even translations didn't help. This volume, on the other hand, deals with a situation where the cultural behaviors behind the language, including body language, are so different that actual communication is almost impossible. A fascinating concept!

Trev is a human who isn't terribly unhappy with his new alien "master". In fact, the Tanarran is extremely polite, always wants to give Trev presents, and is extremely attractive (if somewhat purple). Trev falls in love, but the lack of an emotional response from Yanai gets to him. He needs to know his lover is involved with him outside the bedroom as well as when they have sex. Which they manage to do often and well. And why does Yanai keep calling him "pet"? Trev has a name, darn it! Trevor wants more, and he gets so desperate that he asks for some time off when they arrive on Earth. All he wants to do is have some time to think, and make some friends.

Yanai has no clue what is wrong with the human. He senses something is off, but all the signals he has given Trev about how much the man means to him seem to leave Trev cold. The human still calls him by his given name, instead of giving him an endearment, something only they will share (even though Yanai has long-since started to call him pet). And now he wants to leave? Yanai is devastated, but his culture demands he remain calm, show no emotion, and give the man he loves deeply anything he asks for. Including his freedom, even if it tears Yanai apart.

See where the problem is? It was devastating for me to watch both sides, see how each was misconstruing the other's signals by interpreting them using their own cultural perspective. It took them a while, but even when they finally begin to figure what their issues may be, it is still tough for them to adapt to each other's deeply ingrained ways of behaving. I really enjoyed watching them as they figure out what is what.

If you like science fiction stories with men from two different cultures who don't even notice they're simply misinterpreting much of what they do, if you enjoy reading about yet another alien culture, one that operates on scents and pheromones, and if you're looking for a hot read full of heated exchanges and emotional upheavals, then you will probably like this novella.

If I was going on my own personal taste, it would be a two star, but I finished it and I didn't hate it. I was just

bored.

I highlighted a few things that jumped out as ridiculous: "There were moments when he thought they were well on their way to becoming spouses," - that was the slave owner, and then also a line about how he wasn't *really* meant to be a slave owner, so he only knew how to treat Trev as an equal. Finally...I don't know, just another throwaway line similar to the ones in the other books about how Trev had made peace with never seeing his family again. Really? Even when he went back to Earth, he wasn't tempted to see them again? That whole bit baffles me in this whole series. Honestly, I'm not sure I'd want a partner who could so easily give up their family.

Going back to the first line, there was mention of Trev asking if he could be sent home a couple of times in the first few months he was with Yanai. Trev didn't want to be a slave, and time was the only thing that wore down his need to go home. I know it's just fantasy goop and not to be taken seriously, but I can't understand how Yanai could possibly think he's on the way to being spouses with his slave. You own the dude! Call a spade a spade...er, slave.

Everything is so *nice*. The author mentions that some human slaves don't have it so easy, and I think I'd want to see what she could come up with from that. I've been reading this other series, Love Slaves of the Alphas, and it does make me appreciate that Jana Downs gives her slaves some backbone, and her dominant-owner types aren't psychopathic and cruel. But it's like two opposite extremes on the spectrum. I have a feeling this author could be more realistic, or add just a touch more controversy--in fact, I have faith that she could if she wanted to.

*This book is part of a series and is best read in order.* When Trev was handed over to his new master, when he was chosen for the lottery, he was worried but that worry soon turned to love, now heading for Earth with Yanai he wants his feelings returned or he wants his freedom. Yanai is besotted with his human and will do anything for him, but Trev always seems to reject what is offered and Yanai does the only thing he can think of... he lets Trev go. Can Yanai and Trev overcome their miscommunication of their customs or is it too late for them to share their love with each other?

So in this new addition to the *Owned* series Trev has already been with his owner for nearly a year, so the relationship is already well established but that doesn't mean that everything is perfect.... far from it. Trev wants more than to be a beloved pet to Yanai so when Yanai refuses to give Trev his heart Trev asks to be released when they reach Earth. Yanai is devastated when Trev wants to leave him but his only other option

would be to give Trev his heart... and he can't live without it.

It soon becomes clear to us that there are huge misunderstandings going on between the two lovers, even after nearly a year neither really knows much about the others customs and it takes a while and also some nagging from the gray men for Trev to realize it isn't all Yanai's fault either. Now while they both try to reconcile and express themselves in a way the other fully understands there is more going on in the background of the story. Yanai wins another human in the lottery which Trev is unhappy about, but they have much more to be concerned about when the Pressian's turn up demanding the return of Trev.

I really love this series because with each one we are introduced to more information about the Pressian's and their subjugation of the Eoeans, but finally we are given a hint that maybe the Pressian's bullying might be coming to an end. Trev and Yanai are wonderful characters who are incredibly in love with each other they just didn't know how to communicate with each other, they are an incredible hot couple who burn up the sheets and give us some really hot sex. We see characters from Bound by Deception, and you even warm up to the gray men after a while because they certainly develop as we see more of them.

I have to recommend this to those who love aliens and humans falling in love, reconciling after misunderstandings, hot sex, passionate love, a desperate escape and a wonderful romantic, hot and sexy ending.
