Her life in the crumbling town of Ault, Colorado, in foster care, was rather tragic. Clyde had been her foster father for the last twelve years. She had just turned 6 years old when Clyde and his wife Claire had taken her in, but Claire had succumbed to breast cancer just three years after she had arrived. Clyde descended into a dark circle of booze and depression and never did recover, leaving Maisey to raise herself.
