This book was originally called The Dealer and my copy goes by that title so I got confused because I was searching for a different title. I was surprised at how many there are in this series when I searched by series title. I'm really into books like I, Q; Alex Rider; and, of course, Cherub Missions. They are all so awesome, I just love the whole teenage spy thing! It sounds so cool! If you like that sort of thing, go for it! The Cherub Missions are absolutely amazing, the first one, Mission: The Recruit, was a good way to introduce some back story to how the kids become agents. The action mostly came towards the end, although there wasn't much and the author made it clear that his reason behind not putting in much action was because that if the mission seemed high risk it would be odd, because your first missions are never high risk, you learn as you go, and get higher risk missions as you move along. The second, Mission: The Dealer (or, as it is now known by, Class A, because of the Class A drug, cocaine.) Meine Meinung

„Top Secret 02: Heiße Ware“ ist der zweite Teil einer endlos langen Reihe und, meiner Meinung nach, kann man da auch schnell mal den Überblick verlieren. Dem ist aber nicht so. Vielleicht liegt es daran dass ich den ersten Teil erst vor wenigen Wochen gelesen habe, vielleicht nicht; jedenfalls wird alles wichtige aus dem ersten Teil noch einmal wiederholt und die Einzelheiten lassen sich auch schnell wieder im Gedächtnis abrufen. Außerdem gefällt mir die Entwicklung des Protagonisten James. Er macht sich langsam. Ist er anfangs noch ein verwöhntes, arrogantes Kind so kann er in diesem Teil schon einige Sympathiepunkte sammeln. Meistens jedenfalls, nicht immer. Bei Homophobie kriege ich das kalte Kotzen und Ausschlag, da ist es völlig egal wie gut ich was finde. Verdroschen gehört sowas! Allerdings sollte man auch nicht außer Acht lassen dass das nun mal erst der zweite Teil ist, da erwarte ich keine Wunder, sondern Realismus.

Nach wie vor setzt Robert Muchamore das ganze Konzept von CHERUB gut um. Das sind keine Wunderkinder die die Lösung auf alle Probleme haben, sondern intelligente Kinder mit spezieller Ausbildung. Der Fokus liegt auf das Aufbauen von zwischenmenschlichen Beziehungen und zeigt immer und immer wieder, dass der Mensch das schwächste Glied der Kette ist. Die Knüpfung der Freundschaften sind altersgerecht dargestellt, die Interessen und Gesprächsthemen dem Durchschnittsalter angepasst. Man kann sich vielleicht darüber streiten was Kinder in diesem Alter machen, aber ganz so abwegig fand ich das Bier trinken jetzt nicht. Und an dieser Stelle werde ich mit Sicherheit auch nicht erwähnen was ich mit 13 so alles veranstaltet habe.

Natürlich bleibt die Geschichten irgendwo kindlich und vereinfacht, aber genau das erwarte ich auch wenn ich mich dazu entschließe ein Buch mit Kindern als Protagonisten zu lesen. Ich habe nach wie vor große Hoffnung, dass die Geschichte mit den folgenden Teilen immer erwachsener wird. Ansätze sind genug vorhanden, denn auch in „Top Secret 02: Heiße Ware“ stellt sich James am Ende die Frage ob das alles so richtig ist, wie ihm es beigebracht wurde. Und Robert Muchamore scheut sich auch nicht davor mal in den Raum zu werfen, dass auch die Bösen einfach nur Menschen sind. Viel zu oft werden die Bösen als Monster dargestellt, die nichts Menschliches in sich haben. Diese Sichtweise teilt der Autor in seinen Büchern glücklicherweise nicht, das wäre mir auch viel zu vereinfacht.

Die Informationen, die James und seine Freunde für die Mission bekommen sind (für einen Laien) übersichtlich und leicht verständlich, es wirkt sorgfältig recherchiert und vielleicht kann man sogar das eine oder andere lernen, was mich, ehrlich gesagt, ziemlich überrascht hat.

Hin und wieder kommt auch durch dass der Autor eigentlich einen ziemlich amüsanten Humor hat, den er gerne mehr einbauen könnte, aber da kann ich ja dann vielleicht was in den folgenden zehn Büchern zum Lachen haben, denn ich werde definitiv weiterlesen.

The entire CHERUB series has 12 books in it, starting from The Recruit and ending in Shadow Wave. (WARNING: SPOILERS) Class A is James Adams' second mission. James works for CHERUB, a secret agency that uses kids as agents instead of adults because they are less suspicious. CHERUB was founded by a man named Charles Henderson, who served as a British spy in France during World War II. He used 12 year old boys as spies in Germany and turned it out to be a great success. Henderson died later and the boys split up after his death. Afterwards, CHERUB was founded. 4 children had died during CHERUB's long operating years, 2 unknown, 1 from a snake bite and (the most gruesome) a land mine. James got sent to CHERUB at the age of 12 after hurting a girl named Samantha. James' first mission was when he was sent to live in a hippy town for a short time. The operation was successful.

Now James faces his most difficult mission yet: arresting a millionaire drug smuggler named Keith Moore. In this book is a mixture of guns, cars and drugs.
