This series was one of the first I read to re-introduce myself to the erotica genre. I remember being struck by the fact that each book in this series had a plot that allowed the reader to get involved with the characters. While that statement is true of all the books, some are stronger than others, and I feel that this is one of the weaker ones. Rose has emotionally walled herself off, done so completely that she can no longer feel physical pleasure. To me, that makes Rose extremely weak, especially since the traumatic event happened at the beginning of puberty for her. Why would she not talk to her mother, or her aunt for that matter about the events that lead to her parents' divorce and the promise extracted by the nanny? On the other hand, I found it quite entertaining to read about Matt and how he tried to fight falling for Rose. The sex scenes were erotic and very steamy, but also felt somewhat forced between the two of them, more like they were being pressured to perform, rather than a natural progression of Rose's therapy. It was an enjoyable read, but nothing spectacular.
