The sound of his daughter's laughter, the look of happiness on her beautiful little face, nothing in the whole world could or would compare to that for Liam. This is what his entire life was about. It had not always been this way, no it was bad, very bad before. There is a secret that Liam has been keeping and it is actually multi-faceted. Moving to the mountain with his daughter (Emma,) and getting their dog (Jasper,) living away from the negativity and brutal ways of the outside world is where they belong. Until the storm like the one now happens that is. The outside storm to bring turmoil and a storm of many things internally is where Liam learns about something he has refused to acknowledge.

Getting as far away from the texts, the calls and the pressure...that is all that Casey can think of. Liam is headed to the other cabin, the one that will have a guest arriving shortly, to make sure everything is in order, he spots something in the snow. Fear and dread fill him, but it is what he finds that takes him back to instinct. He picks this unconscious woman up and take her to his cabin. Once there the real lesson begins.

With a start Casey wakes up, realizes something is not right. Hearing voices, smelling food, clouded thoughts all what brings Casey around to the living again. When she goes in search of these, there is a bigger turn of events about to happen. Liam is talking to her, filling her in on some of what had happened, then SHE comes in. Emma and Jasper come in from playing outside. It is when Emma realizes there is a stranger there that she becomes the shut down and withdrawn little one she has learned to be due to cruelty and hurt. Liam is also very tense. Casey picks up on this but stands her ground, then after some introduction Emma faces Casey full on, and the reason for this little girl's reaction is apparent. Casey is not in the least bothered by this, in fact she is kind and caring. It takes some time but Emma does warm up to Casey, slowly but very much so. As this is unfolding in front of Liam's eyes, it dawns on him that he too is warming up to Casey as well. This feeling hasn't been there in a very long time, and never this strong.



Things between them heat up slightly and Casey shuts them down quickly. Then heats up, shuts down. There is nothing going to stop the chemistry between them from overpowering them, which it really does. A letter to Liam starts putting things that are problematic back in the forefront of this. But not until there is a breakthrough with Emma and Casey and Liam, and even Jasper (as a bystander only.) The little girl afraid to see or talk or be seen by anyone other than her daddy and Jasper, and now Casey, faces an obstacle that has been the hardest hurdle to this point. But she does it, and it is the beginning of a deeper feeling between all of them. Liam opens up and shares what happened, how Emma became the way she is, and the secret he has been hiding for many years now. When Casey doesn't open up and share as well, there is mixed emotions, words exchanged in the heat of the moment, tears, regret, and an important call made.

That call to Aunt Jen made Casey reopen scars she thought she had buried. When that phone call ends, Casey goes back to Liam and finally breaks her silence about her dark secret. Then true feelings are shared. Finalizing decisions made, and another painful event brought to light. This one is between Liam and the grandparents to Emma. Cruel and hurtful but now resolved and relieved he has been able to talk to Casey about this, they face them head on. It is also the point when Casey finalizes her decision and Liam helps her face her secret head on as well. Emma is left with her grandparents (she doesn't like this but knows that Casey is facing things she doesn't like as well) and Liam and Casey face down her demons, the two of them. Aunt Jen meets Liam, Casey's mom is confronted, Casey's dad is confronted, closure happens....a good thing, a long time coming.

Heading back home, there is another problem, the cabin is empty. The grandparents are to blame, on top of that, they can't even do it, they can't keep Emma under their watch. Liam knows where to look, and goes to get his daughter. Casey, Emma, Liam and Jasper all make it to the hotel together, but Liam is now going to face the final chapter of his secret, giving his final "talk" to the grandparents, which he does.
