This book traces the journey of two teenagers when both of them are caught in the fire of cyber-bullying, thereupon bringing them closer but their way to salvation is not an easy one, it has challenges and emotional difficulties, which they need to overcome. Once again Katie has presented a story of young love with deep feels and obviously with a motorcycle club!

Meet Breanna Miller who is the fifth of the nine children in the Miller family and subsequently, she is also the genius in her high school. Now she is the kind of girl, who is responsible about her life, and thus she never messes with herself by indulging in the teenage frivolities. Meet Thomas Turner, commonly known as Razor, member of the Reign of Terror motorcycle club and also attends the same high school with Breanna. Now he is the kind of guy whom people want to keep a distance from mainly because of his brooding and introvert nature. Sparks fly almost immediately between these two teenagers, when Razor stands up like a gentleman and helps out Breanna. But this sweet feeling of theirs is threatened when at a party their photograph is taken and later posted online, that instead of bringing them closer might destroy everything they care about, Breanna's reputation and Razor's dream to be the permanent member of the motorcycle gang.

Once again the author has portrayed the positive and realistic side of a motorcycle club. The author features that the members of such a club respects their seniors and cares for the extras and the juniors, and their bond is unbreakable no matter whatever comes their way. In this book, too, the author captures real-life issues in the life of a teenager when they face the death of a loved one. The cyber-bulling and blackmailing social

issues are strongly depicted and the author sensitively yet realistically handles them.

The relationship between Razor and Breanna plays the strongest role in the book and everything happens surrounding these two. The relationship evolves at a slower pace so insta-love haters must grab a copy of this young adult love story. Breanna is initially scared of Razor mainly because of his motorcycle background, but eventually Breanna's fear succumbs to something promising. Thus their physical as well as emotional attraction also grew and made them closer and finally inseparable. The author's representation of their love story is not only sweet and heart-felt but it is something passionate that will sync not only with a young heart but also with a grown-up/mature heart.

From the very first page, I was glued to the story and to be honest, I actually loved this story more than the author's previous book from the same series. The emotions are layered cleverly into the plot by the author and it is quite amazingly done, as the book made me cry and laugh with its rhythm. And with the progress of the story, it turned into something deeply intense that certainly ached my heart. The author's writing style is evocative with an equally free-flowing narrative that kept me glued to the pages of this book. And with a pace neither too slow nor too fast, felt very synchronized with the story's development.

The characters are extremely likable, honest and authentic, their genuine demeanor will make the readers reach out for them through the pages of the book and give them a hug, especially, the two main characters, Breanna and Razor. Both Breanna and Razor are struggling with their lives, Breanna is the one who has to take care of her four younger siblings as among them she is the oldest and her parents have full-time jobs because of their poor financial condition. And sadly, the siblings simply don't see eye-to-eye with Breanna because of her perfection. On the other hand, Razor is suffering from loss of his mother's death and there is heavy tension between him and his father and also between him and the members of his motorcycle club, as recently he has got to know that there is an underlying mystery to her mother's death and the elders are keeping it from him. So both the characters face a lot of struggle hence their love is also not an easy one.

In a nutshell, this page-turner is a must read as the story will move the readers with its poignant yet sweet aspect.

Katie McGarry is my go-to author for YA drama/romance. She writes highly emotional but beautiful stories with fantastic insight into the dramas of mature teenagers, with none of the stupid behaviour that you so often see with younger characters. She never lets me down, and she's given us another wonderfully romantic and intense story with this one.

This is the second book in the *Thunder Road* series, featuring a group of teens raised in the Reign of Terror MC. The club is legit, but the boys live the biker lifestyle, and this book tells the story of Razor - son of a well-respected board member and best friend of Oz from *Nowhere But Here*. Razor has only recently fulfilled his life-long dream and patched in as a full member, but a secret from the past continues to plague him, and when knew information comes to light, his reluctance to let it go threatens all he has found with his club.

Breanna is a smart, sensible and responsible girl - the middle of 9 children, she is counted on to help out at home, to the detriment of her having the life that she wants. For years she has lived a quiet, restrained life, but now that she is entering her senior year she is desperate to break free and be herself,

*I'm searching for magic – not the Christmas morning type, but the type of magic that can be found by being courageous, being the girl who takes chances, being the girl who will dance. I want to be the girl who is seen.*

When Brenna is targeted by a bully at school, fellow senior Razor comes to her defence, and they agree to a deal – Razor will provide Breanna with ongoing protection in exchange for her helping him solve the mystery from his past. Brenna is highly intelligent with an analytical mind and she craves mental stimulation – the puzzle that Razor presents her with is irresistible, and it doesn't hurt that she finds Razor wildly attractive. Razor has seen that there is more to Brenna than she lets on, and as much as he needs her help, he is also drawn to her and wants to help her, so the deal is struck.

*“Hey, Breanna.”*

*I glance over my shoulder. “Yes?”*

*“Be safe.”*

*Those are two enticing and lovely words. “I will be. I have you protecting me, right?”*

*Maybe I’m misreading Razor, but his eyes travel my body like he might toss me onto the bed of the truck and kiss me in a way I’ve never been kissed before. “Don’t worry. I completely have your back.”*

From the very beginning there is a spark of attraction between Razor and Brenna which is undeniable, but when an innocent moment between them is photographed and taken way out of context, Breanna becomes the target for blackmail and their arrangement becomes something a whole lot more intense as they band together even tighter to find answers, and as the relationship between them becomes something incredibly special.

*This is heartbreaking and consuming and addictive. It’s terrifying and peaceful, crazy and serene. It’s a million things in one brief moment and it’s something I don’t understand and never want to live without.*

Oh my God, this romance is absolutely gorgeous! From completely different lives, Razor is the tattooed, scary-looking member of an MC and Breanna is the sweet, innocent good girl. But they come together in a way that is natural, honest, and completely open. They trust each other completely, hiding nothing from each other and their gradual fall into love was beautiful to watch.

*Most people avoid me, easily leaving two feet between us, and here is this little warrior trudging into battle without armor.*

*Terrified I'll break her, I weave my arms around her and hug her back. My eyes shut when she settles furthering into me. I rest my cheek on her head and simply breathe.*

But things at home (for both of them) continue to cause problems. Brenna is fighting to be heard and is drowning in the midst of her family dramas, and Razor's lack of faith in his club over the secrets they refuse to share, and his tendency to look out for himself without asking for help from others leaves him in a precarious position. Together, and individually, Brenna and Razor are on a journey to discover who they are, what they want, and how to find it.

This story is so beautifully written. Brenna and Razor's individual stories are told from their own POV and with so much emotion, I could feel everything that they were feeling, and my heart pounded through all of their ups and downs. And it just made what they found in each other and their moments together so much sweeter! Sweet, romantic, passionate and all-consuming – you can see how perfect they are for each other. It's a real 'against the odds' type of romance, and it beautifully done.

*"I promise I'll take care of you," he whispers. "You're safe with me."*

Razor's journey in particular ties in really well with the overarching storyline featuring drama within the MC. I really enjoyed watching his struggle to find his place, and I loved the dynamics between him and the other guys in the clubs – friends, mentors and his own father, the relationships were beautifully explored and I really liked the way that whole storyline played out.

The central group of characters introduced in the first book all appear, and again those relationships are written in a way where you can feel the bond between the group. I loved seeing Oz and Emily again, and with a bit more insight into Violet's story, I am hoping hard that her and Chevy's book is up next!

I'm loving this series. Emotional and romantic, and a great mix of edgy drama with some great light moments, this was a fantastic read. I can't wait for more.

*Nowhere But Here* was one of my favorite books last year and having enjoyed most of Katie McGarry's books, I was **eager to read *Walk the Edge***. While the romance in this book was the highlight for me, I experienced some **frustrations** due to some side characters.

First off, what I loved about *Walk the Edge* - the characters! Both Razor and Breanna were **fantastic characters** that I was easily able to root for. My favorite undoubtedly was Breanna, who was a sweetheart. As a middle child in a family of 9 kids, she was left a bit to the sidelines when it comes to attention and had to bear a ton of responsibilities, including taking care of her younger siblings. She was a **smart young girl** and even though she had to juggle so many aspects that a teenager shouldn't have to at that age, she did it without ever outwardly complaining. It's easy to sympathize with Breanna and **feel for her** throughout the book. I really wanted to give the poor girl a hug! No one deserves that kind of negativity in their lives.

I was glad when Breanna finally found, Razor, who was truly **a great love interest**. Razor was **dealing with his own issues**, having recently found out that his mother's death may not have been what he thought it was. His situation was also really heartbreaking, especially because he was also struggling with his father and his motorcycle club. Together, Razor and Breanna were **a lovely couple**. From their very first meeting, they had a lot of sparks together and their chemistry was undeniably strong. **I loved watching them getting to know each other** and in the process, learning to know about their own selves too. **Their romance had the perfect balance of steamy and sweet** and I shipped them like nobody's business. I thought they were really good for each other despite being so vastly different in personalities.

What I really struggled with in *Walk the Edge* were the **secondary characters**. Breanna's family, her parents particularly, were quite honestly **terrible**. They had all these kids and they emotionally manipulate Breanna to look after them since they had to work full-time job to financially keep the family afloat. It angered me how time and again they forced their kids to do jobs that should have been theirs. Not to mention, when they find out Breanna's involvement with Razor, they suddenly decided to act like doting and protective parents, when time and again in the book, that they were terrible. At one point, because of a rumor, Breanna's dad calls her a "whore" and I was ready to punch the guy. Breanna also experienced **bullying** in this book from, Kyle, a douche athlete who threatens to release compromising photos of her with Razor if she doesn't write his term papers. He was a real nuisance and the further the story went on, the more annoyed I became with him and the book. I guess what I'm trying to say here is **I had all these negative emotions throughout the book because of these characters and that led to my not enjoying the book as much as I could have**.

What I Liked:

I've read Pushing the Limits, Dare You To, Crash Into You, Take Me On, Nowhere But Here, and now Walk the Edge, and while Pushing the Limits holds the only five-star rating from me, I think Walk the Edge is probably my favorite of McGarry's full-length novels. I remember being utterly blown away by McGarry's debut, but I think this book is better, even if my ratings of the books wouldn't make it seem so. I didn't like Nowhere But Here as much as I'd hoped, but that was for reasons that were pretty specific to that book. I knew I'd want to continue with the Thunder Road series, and I am very glad that I did!

This book focuses on Razor and Breanna. Razor (legal name Thomas Turner) is the only patched-in member of the Reign of Terror motorcycle club that attends the high school (he's eighteen, which is the minimum age). He is a man of few words, and everyone is terrified of him. Everyone including Breanna Miller, fifth of nine children, and relative genius of the high school. Breanna has never felt like she belonged, not at school, or in her own family. Razor chivalrously helps her out at the school one day, and the pair can't stop thinking about each other. When a photo is taken of them and Breanna is threatened and blackmailed, Razor and Breanna are determined to make sure that the photo never surfaces, because it's not just Breanna's reputation at stake.

I got sucked right into this book, which actually surprised me a little. These books of McGarry's are really long, and often start off pretty slowly. This story has a beautiful cadence to it. It starts a few days before senior year is going to start for Breanna (and Razor). The first scene does not involve them meeting. We see Razor exactly as who he is and how everyone sees him - cold, silent, dangerous, a lit fuse slowly burning. We see Breanna as she is - swamped with familial responsibilities, constantly giving up what she wants, to help her parents with their other eight children. Totally unfair, and I will get to her parents/family in the next section. But anyway.

Breanna and Razor meet for the first time several scenes later, and it is downright hilarious. Breanna is convinced that Razor and the other Terror boys are going to rob and murder her, and Razor is both amused and annoyed that she would think that. You can see the attraction in this first meeting. After this, the pair can't seem to stay away from each other. It's not like Breanna just magically got over her fear of Razor and the club - no, not at all. But the more little interactions they have, the more you can see Breanna opening up to Razor, and vice versa.

I love how McGarry builds the relationship. The physical attraction is so there, but also an emotional connection that both breaks and warms my heart. Both of them are dealing with so much in their own worlds. Razor has been silently grieving his mother's death, which happened when he was ten. Years later, he's now finding out details about her death that make it seem like it wasn't a suicide. Razor hasn't been the same since her death, but you see a different side of him with Breanna. And Breanna - she can be herself with him, because he thinks she's awesome.

Razor is constantly on edge during this story, with a lot of negative tension between him and his father. Breanna has different problems; she has to drop what she is doing and take care of her younger siblings often. She is often forgotten by her parents, and it seems like no one cares about her except her best friend Addison, but even Addison has her own problems. Razor and Breanna are from two completely different worlds, and yet, they are their own moths to each other's flames.

Have I mentioned that I love the romance? Their relationship is lovely to watch unfold, and the chemistry between the two is smoking. Breanna is pretty innocent and sweet, the nice naive type, and Razor is your bad boy, danger wrapped in a pretty boy's skin. But the combination is combustible, and the two of them are really swoony together. Razor especially! He might be my favorite McGarry boy. \*fans self\*

The story revolves around Razor and Breanna's relationship, as well as how Razor deals with finding out new information about his mother's death. The Terror know more than they are letting on, and Razor isn't trusting them. The story is also heavily focused on the blackmail and cyber-bullying. Breanna has to write English papers for the star football player, or he'll post a compromising picture of Breanna and Razor online. This aspect of the story is heartbreaking, but I LOVE how it unfolds. There is drama but Razor and Breanna work to make sure that Breanna doesn't have to do anything that she doesn't want to do.

The story's climax and ending -- I love how Breanna and Razor deal with the blackmail and the photo! The two of them face the issue individually, so it's not that Razor comes to Breanna's rescue or Breanna refuses Razor's help. We also learn about Razor's mother's death, which was so heartbreaking for Razor. The ending is kind of sad, but also very happy. I think Breanna's parents should have cut her a break a little more (see below), but I love how the very last few lines wrapped up the story. Overall, I'm very happy with this book!

#### What I Did Not Like:

I absolutely hate Breanna's parents. They have nine kids, and they ignore Breanna for the entire book, until the very ending of the book. And at the ending, they realize that they were sh\*\*\*y parents and suddenly they put a super over-tight leash on Breanna. It's kind of infuriating, for many reasons.

I don't mean to step on people's toes, but why IN THE WORLD do people have so many kids when you KNOW you can't support them, financially, emotionally, etc.? Both Mr. Miller and Mrs. Miller work full-time, and I believe the oldest four Miller children are out of the house. Breanna is the "oldest" and she's practically raising her younger four siblings. HOW IS THIS OKAY?! Parents, why do you think it's okay to have your older children raise your younger children?! I remember getting angry about this in Huntley Fitzpatrick's books (which I loved). DON'T HAVE SO MANY KIDS if you can't support them in every possible way! I know what I'm talking about - both sides of my family have many siblings (ten of my dad's, six of my mom's). Don't do that!

Do you see why I'm so angry? So often does Breanna have to give up so much (private school, social life, potential love life) to take care of her younger siblings, like she's a single mother at seventeen with four kids. Her parents are so incredibly selfish for having so many kids. They are never attentive to Breanna, or even

the other "older" young siblings (kids #6, and 7). And Breanna's older siblings hate her because she's the "perfect" one, but really, she's just trying to keep her family together. Which is NOT HER JOB.

I realize that this isn't entirely an issue I have with this book specifically, but so many times, I wanted to strangle the Miller parents. So. Many. Times.

Would I Recommend It:

Ahem. Despite abhorring the Miller parents, I totally recommend this book, especially if you're a YA contemporary romance fan. McGarry's books have it all - tough issues, steamy romance, swoony bad boys, sweet and tough heroines. I don't really care for motorcycle clubs but I am enjoying this series by McGarry!

Rating:

4 stars. A great addition to the Thunder Road series! I'm glad I decided to keep going, despite not liking Nowhere But Here as much as I'd hoped. I'm looking forward to Violet and Chevy's story, which is next!
