Peter's friend Bruno always wears the same hat. They're best friends and do many things together. One day other kids tease Bruno about his hat. Peter speaks up the first time but the teasing continues and Peter makes the choice to play with Sergio and Leah instead of Bruno. He stays quiet when they tease Bruno and make fun of his hat, etc. Peter finds his voice and speaks up for his friend. At the end, they are all playing together and wearing the silly hats.

Use to talk about speaking up for friends and how to handle bullies.

The illustrations are brightly colored. The character's expressions tell the story to support the text. The author captures the essence of elementary playgrounds everywhere.

This is a story that is actually told from Bruno's best friend's point of view. He and Bruno love to play together, and Bruno always wears his funky fun hat. That's never been a problem until one fateful day when one of their classmates decides that Bruno's hat is... not cool. It all unravels from there.

This book plays at some of the tensions that we feel when we come across teasing and bullying, and provides multiple moments to have conversations about what goof friendship looks like. A useful social emotional resource if you don't have one you love already.

I would like to begin with a quote from the back flyleaf:

"One of Flyaway Books' goals is to help readers see the world from a new perspective. It's especially important to consider bullying from the point of view of children who witness it. They're often encouraged to report bullying and offer support to those who are bullied, but their own feelings and fears are often overlooked. Bruno's Hat helps fill that gap while reminding children that friendship though it offers great joys, also comes with responsibilities.

I found Bruno's Hat to be a very different book about bullying because of the above two paragraphs. The author's unique approach to bullying makes this a must have book for children of all ages.

This is a hardcover book with a dust jacket that is exactly like the full color cover underneath. The characters are adorable animals, making it appropriate for younger children to relate to, but the content applies to older children as well.

The front and back flyleaved have colorful pictures from the book itself.

This is one of the best books I have ever seen about bullying. The vocabulary and storyline make this an easy book to read and understand, with an easy to read font.

Canizales is an experienced writer for children, helping kids deal with sensitive issues that occur in their lives. His books have been published in six languages.

My only criticism/confusion is that while the book is "published " in the U S, it is "printed " in China.

Pete, his friend, didn't really notice that Bruno wore a weird hat until another kid pointed it out and started picking on Bruno because of the hat. Even though Pete knows that making fun of Bruno is wrong, he doesn't want to be considered a weirdo by association.

The story is a good one for kids who might know someone who is being bullied--it lets them see how it can hurt the person being bullied and how they are in a position to stand up and help stop the bullying.
