Unfortunately, the whole situation seems to bring out the worst in all of the characters, because... Oh. My. God. What is wrong with these people? Seriously. Dave is a vindictive, spoiled ass. Kasie lives in a dream world full of fantasies and delusions and is flaky to the n'th degree. And Robert! Picking up after *The Stranger* finished, Kasie is dealing with the consequences of Dave finding out about her affair with Robert Dade. That man is hot-as-hell, DAMN! ok, back to what I was saying. Dave has coerced her into staying with him and paying for her mistake. HOW?

By threatening to go public with her betrayal to her boss, friends and family. Kasie is all about the image she has spent so long coveting and living. She is desperate to keep this info on the down low and therefore goes along with crazy Dave's plan.

But Kasie is in a prison, paying for her mistake in humiliation and verbal abuse. Dave is no longer the safe, easy going lawyer he was. He is cruel, vindictive, malicious and incredibly brutal.

I get it Dave. I'm not belittling your pain. But what you seek is to destroy and humiliate. What you don't seek is reconciliation.

Don't get me wrong. I DO NOT, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE support infidelity of any kind, but...BUT this is a book of fiction and I can see, SEE and UNDERSTAND why Kasie did it. Her waiting to break up first with Dave before sleeping with Robert is obviously what she should have done, but hindsight is 20/20.

Anyways. The hurt and confusion from Kasie's betrayal turns Dave into a monster, feeding off her pain and humiliation. NOT YOUR BEST MOMENT DAVE.

But Kasie doesn't stay helpless for long, Robert Dade is here. But things are more complicated than ending with Dave and moving onto Robert. Kasie eventually takes stock in her own strength and plays the game Dave has so brutally started.

There is sooo much going on here it's crazy! I swear, everytime you think a problem has been solved, a new one comes up. It's not just driving off into the sunset with Robert. HELL NO. WHY?

Because Robert is THE ALPHA. MASTER OF HIS UNIVERSE. ULTIMATE CHESS PLAYER. And Kasie? She fears what she may become with him.

So of course, there was a cliffhanger, not suicide-provoking, but pissed me off immensely! REALLY? I have to wait till May to see what happens between sexy Mr. Dade and Kasie?!!

Part 2 in the Just One Night trilogy and a very dramatic and really very edgy story of revenge and retribution.

Mastering others is strength. Mastering yourself is power

I think I should just start by saying this is most definitely not one of those Fifty Shades style trilogies and Robert Dade is certainly no Christian Grey. I really, really like this series, am enthralled by the beautiful writing style but I think the subject matter is fairly edgy for erotic romance and there's definitely a darker feel to it with brave plotlines involving infidelity, to mention just one. This is a story of mistakes, emotional torture, revenge and retribution. I'm giving it 4 stars based on my reading experience – I couldn't put it down, I was captivated even though by the end of the book, I was reading with dark fascination and squirming uncomfortably.

I'm always a little in awe at the trickery authors can work over your mind. Kasie and Dave have been dating for six years and she has a one night fling – really my sympathy should be with Dave but it's not. What she did was wrong but I understood why she did it and I wanted her to escape that gilded cage and to fly off into the sunset with Robert Dade but nothing is ever quite that simple and this book, this second part of the trilogy, shook up pretty much everything that I thought about that and gave me a different perspective. I feel differently about every single character after this one than I did after the first.

At the end of The Stranger, Kasie's boyfriend Dave has discovered her infidelity and she has returned to him. She has flown too close to the intense brilliance of the sun that is Robert Dade, her wings are severely burnt and now Dave has returned her to the gilded cage she found so constricting before and he holds all the cards. He uses emotional blackmail to force her to stay and his anger verges on abuse. She is trapped, saddened, and imprisoned – only her mind is soaring free as she indulges in a rich fantasy world involving Robert Dade and everything he can do to her to make her body sing.

Dave has branded her a whore, threatened to expose her to everyone she considers important and cares about and he has her right where he wants her. He's acting and responding out of rage and humiliation and, at first, Kasie is lost, doesn't know where to turn but the humiliation and unexpected help from where she least expects it cause her grow cojones of steel and she decides to stand up for herself. Robert wants to help her but Kasie knows that she must extract herself from this mess of her own making.

I said in my review of *The Stranger*, that we hadn't got to know Mr Dade very well and how right I was. We know him better by the end of this book but has Kasie swapped one form of control over her life for another? There is an ocean of sexual energy between him and Kasie and he dazzles her with the brilliance of his presence but Kasie isn't seeing clearly and she doesn't really know the real Robert Dade. While she and Dave shared mutual goals and he offered her a life of predictability, security and stability, Mr Dade can offer her palaces of capitalist riches, untold wealth and success but at what cost?

Empires rise and fall. Kings and queens are overthrown and replaced with others, ones who use different titles, wear different crowns but are every bit as ruthless as their predecessors. We're all replaceable in the end.

Kasie has a pavlovic response to Robert Dade, she cannot resist him but he's a dominant man and control is everything to him and he will crush anything and anyone that stands between him and what he wants. Is Kasie merely swapping one cage for another? Revenge is a recurring theme throughout this second instalment with people seeking retribution for perceived wrongs inflicted on themselves or others they care about which mostly just reflect their own personal anger at their own bad behaviour. No one is behaving well here and it's all a matter of the power and control they are ultimately able to wield and, by the end of the novel, it's clear who wears the crown.

I think I ended this one cold, disturbed, utterly fascinated, slightly uncomfortable and a Happy Ever After seems almost inconceivable at this juncture. I cannot even predict where part three will take us and leave us. I'm still absolutely captivated by the writing style and this is definitely very edgy erotic romance, although there's not actually much in the way of romance in this one. It's most definitely a bit of a departure from the path most erotic romances take and I think it's safe to say that part two is NOT going to be what you expect.

This book was even worse. I can't understand what came over me that I picked up a book where cheating was the main story. Maybe I was biased because for once the girl was cheating instead of being cheated on, but it was just horrible.

I think the author is trying to make Dave look like the bad guy, being all vindictive and cold. But all it's making me think, sitting here and reading this book, is that, he has a right to be. I am sorry, but if I get cheated on, I reserve the right to be a bitch...

Why should that make Dave the bad guy, or more appropriately, why should that make Kasie a victim. I mean she is the one who cheated on him! He blackmails her saying that he will let everyone know that she got down on her knees for a client, but SHE WAS being unprofessional – she is not faultless. But does she sit and think, oh God, I can't believe I slept with a client even after I knew he was a client. Or oh God, I can't believe I cheated on Dave, because no one deserves that?

NO, she does not think those things; instead, she lies there and thinks of ways to murder Dave. Then the next morning she lets Robert feel her up again. What the hell! Did you not say to yourself, to Dave AND to Robert that you would never go there again? Six hours later, with little persuasion, she is pressed up against the wall of her office and at it again with Robert...

To me, it was all lust, lust, lust based on cheating, unprofessionalism, lying, deceiving and just basically being a crappy human being. She says, three quarters through the book, that she won't ever be controlled by Dave again or anyone else, that now that she is once free from Dave's dominance, she will be herself. Then he says something like he will allow her to handle things her way, and she says nothing. I have zero respect for her. I don't think it's sexy how she lets Robert control her like that, especially considering the context and the situation she was in with another controlling man.

3.5 - How can you mend a broken heart? Payback! (Not really)

“Therein lies the defect of revenge: it's all in the anticipation; the thing itself is a pain, not a pleasure; at least the pain is the biggest end of it.”

- Mark Twain

Exposed continues where *The Stranger*, book 1, closed and Kasie is forced to feel the consequences of her actions. Shallow cuts are made to make her slowly bleed. Knife twists are made to deepen the pain. This book wasn't a comfortable read, but Ms. Davis' engaging writing - although convoluted, at times - felt honest and true to human nature.

Kasie Fitzgerald made the choice to sleep with a stranger. He didn't stay a stranger. She's like a moth to flame when it comes to Robert Dade. Fresh out of her shell and feeling more alive than she's ever been, Kasie's duplicity cannot remain unpunished. The story becomes more a character study, as the characters enter a malicious power struggle. It's a private (to a certain degree) and hellish war. The characters sharpen their knives and we watch them slowly bleed. Sometimes, it made for bleak reading, but I could NOT look away!

Kasie, Robert, Dave and a couple of secondary characters play strategic games in and out of business affairs. Occasionally, Kasie's internal struggles added drag to the plot's progression. Whereas I didn't feel an attachment to Dave's character in the *The Stranger*, I felt a burdensome sympathy in part two; I was reminded he was the wronged party, although his payback methods are reprehensible. **We gain valuable insights into several key characters, which are surprising, ominous, and questionable.**

The ending of *Exposed* left me with a feeling of foreboding. It doesn't have the sexually-charged romance between Kasie and Robert dominating the storyline like part one. The ugliness of betrayal and revenge casts a dark shadow in this book. Kiera Davis doesn't simplify and/or provide black-and-white characters to absolve dishonest actions. **The readers are not spared! Ms. Davis convincingly writes about the viciousness of human behavior resulting from emotional pain, destroyed dreams, and the pursuit for power. All is fair in love and war! Right?**

The Rolling Stone's song "Sympathy for the Devil" would be a fitting choice to close the final chapter. What is the nature of a certain someone's game? How will Ms. Davis favorably conclude Kasie's story? I want to know! I anticipate *Binding Agreement*, which appears to be the final installment in the *Just One Night* series.

My Review

Exposed: Just One Night Part 2 is the continuation of Kyra Davis' serialized book. After leaving the readers with a doozy of a cliffhanger, **Exposed** picks up the story of Kasie and her relationship woes right after the events of **The Stranger**.

A lot of people have expressed disgust at this book because the main character Kasie cheated on her long term boyfriend Dave. While I don't condone cheating, I didn't really see it as a "cheating" book. Yes, Kasie was in a long term relationship, but no, they were not yet married, nor was she 100% comfortable it. It doesn't make her actions right; however upon reading the second installment, Kasie's instincts were correct.

"He's a million miles from happy. If he was happy, I'd have the man I once cared for, even if I don't love him. I suck in a sharp breath and like that, I finally admit the evil truth. I never loved the man I agreed to marry. I only wanted the life he provided, the orderliness, the structure, the predictability. That had seemed so important. Funny how those attributes lost their appeal. "

This wasn't a comfortable read at all. Every single alarm bell and abuse red flags were waving as I read this story. Dave pulled out all the stops to degrade, punish, and psychologically abuse Kasie for her transgressions. The psychological abuse and emotional blackmail were especially heinous. I found myself cringing, yet compelled to read on.

Kasie's actions straddled the borderline of TSTL (too stupid to live) and empowered cunning woman. She doesn't take her situation lying down. She empowers herself to fight back, disregarding the danger of her situation. Kasie does risky things, enraging an already angry Dave, even challenging his behavior.

Throughout her ordeal, Kasie is supported by her swoon worthy knight in shining armor, Robert. Robert has a way of making everything just right for Kasie. He's a take charge kind of guy and he makes sure that Kasie is safe and sound in her world. Yet, there is a bit of a sinister aspect there as well.

I enjoyed Ms. Davis writing style and it was interesting seeing everything from Kasie's point of view. As in a serial, the reader is left wanting more. In a way, I wonder if the story would have felt more cohesive if it was offered as a full length novel rather than 3 serialized novellas.

Exposed (Just One Night Part 2) is a fairly short read and I was able to read it in one sitting. I am looking forward to reading the third and final novella in this series **Binding Agreement (Just One Night Part 3)** which is to be published May 2013.
