Corrie Ten Boom was a concentration camp survivor and now (in this book) an itinerant preacher/motivational speaker. She was Dutch and a Christian. She and her family were imprisoned by the Nazis for harboring Jews. Ten Boom died at the age of 91 in 1983.

She went where the Lord sent her, found contacts that would allow her to speak to congregations, those in prison and other groups.

This book is set up as a daily devotional book with a beginning thought or quote followed by her personal experiences witnessing for the Lord. "The Hiding Place" tells of her life growing up in Holland in her father's watchmaking shop, hiding Jews in her attic during WWII, her arrest, and her life in a Nazi concentration camp. Because of her horrific experiences of the labour camp at Ravensbruck, Corrie Ten Boom was able to spend the next thirty-five years testifying of God's providence even through the most difficult circumstances. This particular book can be read devotionally, as each chapter is short and tells a story that stands on its own. Miss Ten Boom explains how she continues to learn to trust in God's wisdom and goodness.
