Wolf from the Past is an intense, compelling and I would even say captivating story of the love between mates – even when they are denied each other by outside forces. Even when one has to “die” in order to escape the constant, unimaginable abuse, only to come alive once again when it’s safe to no longer be in hiding for her life.

Sylvie knew that returning to her brother’s new pack would not be easy. Especially since he had thought her dead. The only way she could survive the abuse of her forced mating was to find the way to die convincingly and to stay hidden until the danger had passed – her former mate’s death. She also knew that running here was bringing danger onto this pack. But she couldn’t live hidden any longer. She deserved the freedom of any member of the pack, she knew that she’d have to earn it as well.

Gator had loved Sylvie, his mate. And had seen her mated off to another. The abuse that she had gone through was obvious, even now long after she had hidden herself through her faked death. She may want him as her natural mate, but that didn’t stop her from still being afraid. Even though he could understand the lingering fear, Gator hoped that in time Sylvie would realize that he only wanted to protect her and care for her as his mate. He would fight for her, even fight her in order to gain the love of his life. Nothing would stop him this time. Nothing.

Even though Wolf from the Past is part of an ongoing series, Salvation Pack, you do not have to have read

the previous stories to enjoy this one. Of course it helps, but you will get enough of the history within the story to fill in the spots that are important for this story. It will, however, probably tempt you to go back and read the series from the start.

Sylvie is truly a wounded soul. Proud, strong and wounded. She will need Gator's patience, affection, and presence in her life in order to heal once again. Gator isn't known for his patience. But he will do what he feels necessary to protect Sylvie. She is his mate and nothing will keep him from her ever again.

I enjoyed this story very much. The main characters were intense, believable and drew me into their situation easily. The secondary characters always make a huge difference for me in an ongoing story and I found everyone in Wolf from the Past to strengthen the story along the way. I've liked this series a lot. N.J. Walters writes big bad sexy werewolves who are all about their women. Hot love scenes and tender moments and characters who have close relationships and look out for each other.

Gator has been one of my favorite characters, a bad ass shifter who is also sweet and nurturing. There was only one woman he ever wanted and he had to stand by when she was forced to mate with another in the Louisiana pack and then was presumably killed by her abusive husband.

When Sylvie turns up at Salvation Pack land he can't believe his eyes. She was left for dead by her husband and hid out in cities until she received word her ex was dead. Now she's in Salvation to find her brother Armand. Now that she's back Gator isn't going to let her go. The Louisiana pack still poses a real threat.

There were some minor issues with this one for me. Sylvie is a victim of brutal abuse and can't stand to be touched by anyone pretty much but within hours of arriving she's stripping off her nightgown and he's going down on her. Okay, I guess. I was conflicted with Gators approach too, he was sweet and patient but I missed the overpowering behavior of the previous heroes. I received a free copy of this book to read and review for Wicked Reads.

How in the world did I miss that N.J. Walters had started another shifter series? As a huge fan of her Legacy and Tapestries series, I jumped at the opportunity to review *Wolf from the Past* with very little hesitation. I suspected there would be a bit of back story I was missing out on, but my experience with the author's writing style made me comfortable enough that I assumed she would fill me in on what I needed to know for this installment. And she did.

Keeping in mind that I have not read the previous books, I fell in love with every member of the Salvation

Pack. While *Wolf from the Past* focuses on Gator Rollins and Sylvie LaForge Dubois, their story cannot be told without involving the other members of the Salvation Pack, especially her brother Armand. Several years ago, Sylvie's mate Andre attempted to kill her after she witnessed him beat his human mistress to death. As this occurred after Sylvie had suffered years of abuse at Andre's hand, she took advantage of the situation and fled, leaving all to believe that her mate had killed her. I'm not sure what shocked me more – that her mate's murder of her went unpunished or that she was able to hide out in large cities, while suppressing her wolf for years. When she learns of her mate's death and that her brother and some of their former pack members had broken away from her uncle's pack, she makes the trek across the country to see him in hopes that she can start her relationship anew with him. She finds that not only is her brother relieved to learn that she is alive, but others in the pack are as well – particularly Gator, the one man who may have grieved her death more than her brother. Unbeknownst to anyone, Gator recognized years ago that Sylvie was his true mate and knew that her father would never allow her to mate with him, preferring to use Sylvie to secure his power within the pack. Oh yeah, Sylvie's father was a real piece of work! While Gator makes her feel safe, Sylvie isn't sure that she can withstand another mating and being tied to a man again, no matter how he makes her feel. Needless to say, Gator has his work cut out for him.

I really enjoyed watching Sylvie come into her own. While events unfold over a short amount of time, we spend so much of that time with Sylvie that the story doesn't feel rushed. The author adds touches of authenticity to the horrific abuse that Sylvie suffered for years throughout the story. Her inability to be hugged by her brother upon her arrival was heartbreakingly sad and while she was able to hug him (and Gator) fully by the end of the book, she was still unable to endure such contact from the other males of the pack. Intellectually she knew they would not hurt her, but her years of abuse made her reactions instinctive. Fortunately the others understood this and were more than willing to accommodate her, even if we do see signs at the very end of the book that they will continue to work with her to overcome the ingrained reaction. Many of the other signs of her abuse are physical and their exposure gives Gator the openings he needs to show Sylvie what a true mating is meant to be like. He never once belittles her or shames her for her scars, quite the opposite actually as he sees her scars as badges of survival. I loved that both Sylvie and Gator had harbored feelings for the other in their youth, yet neither said anything because they knew that Sylvie's father would make things worse than they already were. The chemistry between Sylvie and Gator is intense, yet because of his love and concern for her, their sex scenes are both steamy and tender – seriously swoon worthy. The moment when Gator proves that no one will harm Sylvie is awesome and I kind of feel sorry for the next person who attempts to harm Sadie (not really though). *The Wolf from the Past* was an excellent read and I look forward to backtracking to read the previous books in the series.

While in previous books it's been intimated that Gator is the playboy of the group, it isn't really addressed here. Sometimes jumping into a series can be a big mistake especially if there is quite a bit of world-building to go along with introducing characters. Thankfully, I was able to get right into the story with only a few minor hiccups,

To escape a violent mating, Sylvie has been faking her death for years. Once she receives word her mate was dead, she approaches her brother in his new pack in hopes to have him back in her life. Not only is she welcome back with open arms, but a werewolf she has always had feelings for is part of his pack. Gator was raise in the swamp, always on the frigid of his former Louisiana pack, he has struck out with his friends to

form a new pack. He's always wanted his best friend's sister but her parents have never considered him worthy. Now that she's back in his new pack and in his life Gator will do whatever it takes to protect her from further harm.

Wolf from the Past was a good read. Sylvie was abused fairly harshly by her previous mate and as the story about how she faked her death came into play, it was hard not to feel bad for her. Gator is pretty sexy and intense about his feeling for Sylvie. There's a really instant attraction between them that, at first, was kind of difficult to get over. Let's face it, she was abused pretty badly by her dead mate. For her to jump into a relationship so quickly with Gator had me doubting the velocity of the romance.
