I bought (and read) this today, and I'm having a hard time understanding how it's so highly rated. The editing left a great deal to be desired - I noticed quite a few instances of incorrect pluralization, incorrect use of "to, too", and inconsistent subject-verb agreement. Also, the writing style was clunky and hard to get around - the word choices often left you pausing and wondering why it didn't seem to read smoothly. The syntax was awkward and made the characters sound immature.

The dialogue was only just readable and didn't seem natural for the people speaking, and because of the on-again-off-again neglect of contractions the flow the book was thrown off every few lines.
