Fifteen years ago, Logan Steele walked away from the only woman he has ever truly loved. His strong sense of duty and responsibility would not allow him to leave his ex-girlfriend alone to raise their daughter. For fifteen years, Logan Steele has loved his children fiercely and without a moment's regret, he has built a successful career but, outside of his children and his business, he has not been truly happy. For fifteen years, Logan Steele has tried to forget Lizbeth and make his marriage work but there is only so much a man can take.

After a surprise meeting with Logan's equally handsome twin, Lucas Steele, Lizbeth finds herself caught up in a plot that is meant to reunite her and Logan after fifteen years apart. In the interceding years, Lizbeth has built a successful business and has slept with many, many men but she has never been truly happy. Though there was nothing to forgive Logan for when he left, Lizbeth has never been able to shake her love for him. No man and no amount of success will ever stand a chance when up against the memory of the perfect man. Lucas and Lizbeth have slowly rekindled their friendship so when Lucas invites Lizbeth to his club on Friday night, she has no real reason to say no. Lucas is a crafty bastard and within an hour of getting to the club, Lizbeth is face to face with the only man she has ever truly loved.

Though he intended to take things very, very slowly in order to give Lizbeth time to adjust and process, Logan finds himself buried balls deep in Lizbeth within an hour of their reintroduction. Once the formalities are out of the way, Logan lays all his cards on the table: he is a dad to three amazing kids, he has a signature away from being totally free of his marriage and, no matter how hard it is to work out, he will do anything and everything in his power to be with Lizbeth. For the first time in fifteen long years, Lizbeth is happy and being with Logan again is all that matters. In between bouts of extremely satisfying sexcapades, Lizbeth and Logan begin to work out the details of their situation. All seems to be on track until the moment Logan's brother interrupts to let him know the home his ex-wife and children live in is burning to the ground.

Desperate to see his children, Logan packs his bags and heads for home all the while assuring Lizbeth this is not something that will derail their budding relationship. Though she wants to believe Logan, Lizbeth has been here before and old fears quickly rise to the surface. With Lucas to reassure her that Logan will absolutely honor his commitment to her, Lizbeth does her best to wait patiently for Logan's call. Logan's time with his kids is precious and getting them settled and situated following the loss of their home is critical and something he will not compromise on. Once he is certain his kids are well, Logan turns his attention to his ex-wife and her strange behavior. Though he doesn't want to cause her any more pain, Logan is forced to bluntly and clearly explain to his ex that there is not a snowball's chance in hell of them every getting back

together. His admissions are understandably painful but necessary and will allow Logan to make as clean a break from his ex as if humanly possible.

In the wake of the fire, Logan remains true to his word and true to Lizbeth. He is clearly honest about everything that is happening and Lizbeth assures him she is there for him and will continue to be so no matter what. Little do either of them know how dramatically their lives are going to change when the truth about many, many situations begin to surface.

The Bottom Line: Like the other books in the Heat Wave series, I truly enjoyed this read. Lynne's tendency to introduce a character in the worst light possible and then redeem them completely continues in *Matter of Time*. Lizbeth's initial appearance in Kevin's book was not at all a good in *Crossing Lines*. Lizbeth's previously horrible behavior is thoroughly explained in *Matter of Time* and it doesn't take long to really like Lizbeth. She is compassionate, passionate, caring and, kind and not at all cruel and scheming as she initially appeared. Logan Steele is perhaps the most honorable and responsible man on earth. For fifteen years he denied himself and his feelings at nearly every turn. His love for and loyalty to his children kept him in a loveless marriage for far, far too long. With the help of his twin brother, Lucas, Logan is finally able to find the happiness he has long been denied. While *Matter of Time* is absolutely Lizbeth and Logan's story, it is also quite clearly the launching pad for a new series based on Lucas Steele and his . . . wait for it . . . sex club!! With any luck, Lynne's new series will be as interesting, as entertaining and as sexy as the Heat Wave Series has been.

Matter of Time is the fifth Heat Wave novel by Alannah Lynne, but it can be read as a standalone. I hadn't read anything by her before starting this book, so I really didn't have any idea what to expect. This book was short and sweet, and unfortunately that was a bit of a problem for me. It was too sweet, and things happened too easily for me to really get behind the story.

Logan Steele and Lizbeth Sanders loved each other in college and had planned to get married. They thought that they knew exactly what would happen for them, until Logan found out that his high school girlfriend had gotten pregnant and he had a child he didn't know about. Wanting to do the right thing, he left Lizbeth and married his ex in order to take care of her and their daughter. Fifteen years and two more kids later, his relationship with Bobbi Jo is over and he will do whatever it takes to get Lizbeth back. When his twin brother Lucas runs into Lizbeth at a mutual friend's house, he sets out to help Logan win her back. Feelings between Logan and Lizbeth are as strong as ever but with everything that has happened and all the obstacles between them, do they stand a chance at a future together?

Logan and Lizbeth were okay characters. I didn't feel much of anything about them though, and didn't feel a connection to them. I thought that they clearly cared about each other, but I just wasn't feeling a ton of heat or chemistry there. There was a BDSM aspect to their relationship, but honestly it didn't really seem to work for me. It didn't add any steam to this, and it came off a bit stale to me. I thought that Lizbeth put up absolutely no fight when Logan came back into her life and though it was easy to see she had always loved him, it was also completely unrealistic how things transpired. Logan had broken her heart years before when he chose to leave her for his ex, and they went some 15 odd years with no communication whatsoever. For her to jump right back into bed with him and then they are immediately back together for the long haul was

so unbelievable to me. I didn't buy it at all, and I honestly couldn't even really care at that point what happened with these two. They just basically treated it as though everything that had happened didn't matter because they were finally together and I wasn't okay with that.

I also felt like while there wasn't any drama between Logan and Lizbeth getting back together, there was some with Bobbi Jo that was pretty forced and cliché. It was really predictable as far as how things played out and past truths were revealed and I just didn't really see anything new or memorable here. This whole book was pretty ho-hum for me and while it wasn't horrible, it definitely wasn't great either. Everything just happened too easily and at such an accelerated pace that I never felt invested in the story and found myself wanting to skim to finish it. Though I really liked Logan's brother Lucas, I am not sure if I will give his story a chance when it comes out or not. Overall, this one was pretty disappointing and I don't know that I would recommend it.

A bit of scheming, a whole bunch of surprises most unwelcome, and a love that despite years apart hasn't changed made Matter of Time a pleasing love story.

The times that Lizbeth Sanders has been featured in this series have been interesting. We've seen her not at her best, we've seen her make a pretty big grand gesture, and we've seen her surprised and in this story we see her flummoxed when Logan Steele reenters her life about he broke her heart 15 years ago. I'll admit I really felt for Lizbeth and her situation as she'd never really gotten over her love for Logan even though she understood the reasoning behind him leaving her. After finding out through Lucas that Lizbeth is still single he has been thinking of the possibilities and hopes that Lizbeth will let him have a chance to make it up to her. Well let's just say that this is everything that Lizbeth could hope for but never thought she would have again. Logan and Lizbeth's reunion and chemistry is Sizzling Hot the pages are a blur because I was so engrossed with their renewed affection and continued feelings that they have had for one another through all this time. I struggled a little with writing this review. I really wanted to love this book more than I did. It is a sweet story, but just too easy.

I love second chance stories. They are my favorite kinds of books to read because of an already established relationship that is cut short due to choices or circumstances. Logan and Lizbeth have that history. However, what is also necessary is a present day obstacle that they need to overcome together. And here, I think this story falls short. Logan and Lizbeth fall in love in college after Logan breaks up with his high school sweetheart, Bobby Jo. After visiting home during a break, Logan finds out that he is a father. Doing the honorable thing, he breaks up with Lizbeth and marries Bobby Jo. Now that his kids are older and the marriage is over, he makes a play to get Lizbeth back.

Positives:

Alannah Lynne writes nice prose. There is a ease to her writing. Lizbeth is a really sweet and kind-hearted character. You really can't help but root for her.

Not so much:

I didn't connect with Logan. I know he presented as an honorable man. When his kids and ex-wife are displaced by fire, he does the right thing by bringing them in. This is a complicated issue Logan must confront – can he have both his kids and Lizbeth without hurting one or the other? Who is the priority? Will Lizbeth come in second again? The problem I have with this story is that this difficult situation is resolved

too easily by Lizbeth's selflessness. I feel like it is a missed opportunity to explore something deeper. Additionally, Logan's children are just too easily accepting of Lizbeth up front. I don't know that one pool party and pizza makes for friends.

I also really don't understand the introduction of the BDSM club. It doesn't seem to serve much purpose but to be the location where Lizbeth and Logan reunite. If the club is created to introduce us to Logan's twin, Lucas, then I will look forward to his story. There are threads introduced here I'm interested in exploring.

IN A NUTSHELL:

If you are looking for a sweet, uncomplicated story, this should be on your bookshelf.
