Having become a fan of Charmed recently (bit late I know) my mother brought this book ages ago and when I started to buying the books from eBay she gave it to me along with a few others that she had gotten from a secondhand book store. I'm loving it!

In the first short story, Phoebe wants to have some Samhain (Halloween) fun and asked her sisters to help her cast a spell to summon one of their ancestors from the dead, hoping that they will get to see their recently

deceased big sister, Prue again and for Paige to get to meet her for the first time only its not Prue that is summoned. One of their ancestors, a witch from the French Revolution named Pamela is summoned and takes over Phoebe's body in a hope of saving her centuries old demon husband from a threat that is after him.

In the second short story, Paige is tired of acting like her sisters' maid and takes the advice of a friend to get out partying with her. She meets the new club's owner only to discover that he's a lower demon working with a upper-level demon to take away the world's sun and to have the entire world have night forever. With Paige in a daze, Piper, Phoebe, Cole and Leo have to find a way to stop these demons from taking over the world and give the world back their sun. This story is my favourite so far and is set around Yule or the winter solstice AKA Christmas. I loved this story as you see a completely different side to Paige while she is out of action and you really feel for her.

The third and final short story is about Piper and her desire to have a baby *coughs* Wyatt *coughs* with her husband, Leo. The baby would be half-Whitelighter, half-witch. But when Paige's powers go on the fritz, Piper is forced to have put her desire on hold while she, Leo and Phoebe figure out what to do. Will Piper and Leo get the baby they desperately desire?

If you're reluctant to read this book, I suggest you watch the show first. It will make more since. From what I can gather this book is set during seasons 4 as at the end of the season Piper's pregnant. I loved the book and I really think all Charmed fans should read this.

Firstly I am a huge fan of Charmed! Everything Charmed. From the TV series, the books and the actual interest of Wicca itself. This is one of the books that had been on my bookshelf for a while, and after getting some inspiration from BookRatMisty over on Youtube, I decided to set myself a goal for this October: Spooky Samhain - I picked several paranormal/spooky books to read through the month of October and this was the first one I read. I only read the first of the three stories in the book, the Samhain one and found it to be a nice, enjoyable read. Here is my review:

The main character in this story is Phoebe Halliwell, who on Halloween, decides to contact a dead ancestor. Hoping that it's Prue, she manages to persuade her other sisters to help her perform a seance. They manage to contact an ancestor, Pamela. The candle's are blown out and the sister's believe the spell hasn't worked, but when a voice from inside Phoebe begins to talk to her, she realises the spell went awry. We later find out Pamela has jumped into Phoebe's body so she can contact her demon husband, Qalmor, who no longer kills witch's because of the love spell Pamela placed on him whilst she was still alive, and to inform him his greatest enemy has found a way to destroy him, but at a price.

That's all I want to say on the plot really without giving too much of it away as they are only short stories. I find with all of the TV books like Charmed, Buffy etc, very easy to read because if you've seen the shows we know the characters and find it easy to jump into the world the author is creating for us. This is a good book to read if you are a reluctant reader, don't have much time for reading, or simply a fan of the show.
