Sadly, I observe three theological problems that are subtly implied in the book: (1) limitation of the justice of God, (2) sketchy view of forgiveness (related to the limitation of God's justice), and (3) Keswick sanctification. These problems, however, are not explicitly stated and are only seen in a page or two.

Other than those problems, this book is encouraging, comforting, challenging, and definitely entertaining. This book is truly a blessing! I suggest reading "In the Presence of My Enemies" first before reading this one.
