A Very Vampire Christmas is a (very) short story by popular American author Charlaine Harris. Vampires Dahlia and Taffy are Christmas shopping at the Rhodes Marketplace Mall. Dahlia finds the whole Christmas thing annoying, but the firefighter crew of Engine 34 did save her life during the bombing of the Pyramid of Gizeh hotel the year before, and she wanted to show her appreciation. But then, just as their friend Matsudo Katamori arrives, they become aware of a potentially dangerous situation.

Their new sheriff, Joaquin has issued orders for his nest vampires to remain inconspicuous in situations such as these, but Dahlia can't stand by and see human children suffering. And Taffy and Katamori can't let Dahlia handle this alone. This is billed as Sookie Stackhouse 10.1, but is better described as a story set in the Sookieverse, as Sookie herself never makes an appearance. After this tale, you'll see Christmas elves in a whole new light.... Shopping, sex and blood and gore.
