Three more stories, though I have to say it doesn't say a great deal about the middle one that I completely forgot about it by the next morning. First is another Junior Detective League story, and as increasingly common, it's the best of the three: Dr. Agasa invites the JDL to his uncle's house for a treasure hunt, but Conan uncovers a real mystery to be found there. In the second, Conan may have finally found a clue to the identities of the Syndicate guys who poisoned Jimmy at a gaming convention-- but the guy gets blown up before Conan can investigate. The third sees Richard Moore and co. off for a Sherlock Holmes weekend. Everything's going along smoothly when the host turns up dead, and both Conan and Harley, his rival from the east, are hard-pressed to solve the case before any of the amateur sleuths. Not bad. ***

This volume starts with Dr. Agasa taking the kids to a home that's been in his family for a while but which no one's really been to. He intends a harmless treasure hunt based on simple puzzles for the children to work out. But it turns out someone else has been there - and that a terrible secret from years before still resides there.

It's usually fun to me when we get to see the Detective Boys figuring stuff out on their own. So this is an inconsequential but cute (for a story with a murder mystery) tale based around a cypher that won't make sense if you're not familiar with written Japanese. (Though related, how many dead bodies have these kids seen by now? I'm surprised their parents let them hang out with Conan anymore).

In the next story, Conan and Ran join Mouri at a video games conference, as Mouri's going to be involved in a game. But while there, Conan finds who he thinks is a member of the Black Organization - only to lose him again to an explosion. Conan's left trying to pick up the threads to trace back to the Black Organization before they're lost to him again.

The final story in this volume involves Conan winning a trip to go on a Holmes mystery tour. But when the leader of the tour apparently kills himself, the mystery lovers have to solve a real mystery.

A solid volume, though for me the brightest part was the final tale, where we get to see Heiji return - and

figure out Conan's secret. We also get to see Conan in his element, surrounded by Holmes fans, dealing with a mystery and reveling in his Doyle knowledge.
