And she is a virgin Queen Mother for eternity, while all the creatures around her are enjoying themselves very openly and she sees it all. Which kind of sucks, you know?**

One day, she finds her waters to be flooding with ghosts of dead bodies and she goes rigid. Visiting the Pantheon for the first time in a million years, (because she despises those a-holes) she is quite surprised to find that Hades, dearest Lord of the Underworld is all bound and accused for killing his beloved Persephone. Well, not exactly beloved...

**"Golden dew" was how Linx referred to Persephone, Goddess of Spring, and Hades`...something. The tales were never quite clear on those two.**

Turns out she's been missing for a while and they can't find her body anywhere and Demeter is jumping to conclusions. Anyways, Calypso immediately likes Hades` appearance and **I totally understand her, YOU MUST BE BLIND NOT LIKE THAT:**
