

Reading Another Cup of Coffee is almost like being a fly-on-the-wall of the lives of the book's main characters. Kane makes use of her clear writing skills by having the reader shadow Amy's, Jack's and Kit's lives as they try to make sense of the changes that begin to form an iron grip around their relationships.

A simple tape is all it takes to shake Amy out of her self-imposed solitude and casts the first stone in a sea of change for all involved. I found her an incredibly complex character and it's very telling how an event can have some people bouncing back after a broken heart, whilst for others, it can alter the direction of their entire life. Jack, himself, is not so complicated. His eternal confusion over his feelings leads to a self-absorbed character that hurts the people he loves the most, albeit unintentionally. I did like him though and found myself willing him to make the right choices.

Kit was my favourite throughout. She really reminded me of a well-known writer but my lips remain sealed

on whom! Although her emotions were as much of a jumbled mess as the other two, she seemed more rounded and open to the changes happening around her. The dynamics of the friendship-triangle, along with the old and new friends surrounding the trio, had a nice comfortable feeling to it. Throughout the book you are aware that feelings run extremely deep but the friends will always have each other's backs, no matter what. As the story moves on, you, as the reader, are privy to the realisations and resolutions that begin to form and take place, which lead to a very satisfying conclusion.

I did develop a borderline caffeine addiction whilst reading this but, thanks to the great storyline, it's totally worth it!

An ode to mix tapes! Oh how I miss them!! And in this book it just shows you how the power of a song from way back when can stir up the emotions and set you on a different path when you least expect it!

And this is what happens to Amy who is in her mid thirties, living in Scotland, feeling lonely, stuck in a dull job with no local friends, until she receives a mix tape from her old friend Jack, who she'd not heard from in years. And it just makes her look back on her time with him and their other friends and has her wondering 'what if'.

And so she moves down South to see if her she can find her happy place again, reconnect with old friends and find out what she's been missing out on. It's a scary move for her but something she needs to do and soon finds friends and old feelings are difficult to shake off.

We also get to see the story from the point of view of Jack, who has recently come out but has always seemed to struggle with his sexuality. And his friendship with Kit, a wife and mother who writes steamy erotic fiction, is also another complex aspect of his life.

There are a number of characters in this book who annoyed the heck out of me at times, but that made it feel more relatable! Not everyone is going to be 'your cup of tea (or coffee!)', and they will often do things that annoy you or perplex you, but it's their decision and you can only be there to pick up the pieces or support them whatever they decide to do. It brings into focus the fact that many people are unhappy with how their lives are turning out, they just go with the flow until it is often too late and it takes a big leap of faith to change things and to try and get more out of life - be that changing jobs or trying to reconnect with old friends.

I loved the mix of personalities of this group of friends - they don't live in each others' pockets, it's not all rainbows and laughs, but when faced with a drama they are there to support those who need it no matter what. Many of them have very jealous personalities which can come across as quite petty at times, but that mirrors real life! Nobody's perfect.... are they?! The timeline also jumps around quite a bit which does keep you on your toes!

The songs mentioned throughout were a great blend and often had me grabbing an old CD or looking online to listen to them again as it really helped connect more with the story! An engaging and grown up piece of fiction.
