Weddings are trouble. Just ask Jasmine and Aaron, two firefighters on the same team. In their job, they depend on each other and the other team members to stay safe and alive. Trusting someone with your life is easy though. Trusting someone with your heart? Now that's dangerous! And with an unintended wedding kiss, Jasmine and Aaron can't help but wonder if their hearts are already on the line.

I really enjoyed this book and adore the chemistry between the two leads! Jasmine has always been a tomboy and one of the guys. Aaron is a serial dater, afraid of commitment. The two of them are co-workers and friends and basically part of a family in their firefighter shift team. Since they already know each other, it's easy to see how they could shift from friends to something more. They're already comfortable with each other and after throwing in a wedding kiss are also very attracted to each other. Their conversations feel real as does the way their relationship blossoms.

They both have severe trust issues that they need to overcome, and it was great watching them heal from past hurts.
