I received a copy of this book from Netgalley in exchange for a honest review.

I am actually completely taken aback by how much this book impressed me: though the synopsis intrigued me, I somehow didn't expect to enjoy it quite as much as I did! I'll start with the best part of all, and that is Katie Young's writing! It was just totally breathtaking! I was completely taken aback by how lyrical and gorgeous it was, and it flowed in such a way that I was hooked on it while reading. There is some really beautiful and meaningful imagery in this novel, paired alongside some morbidly brutal scenes. Yet I was entranced by both! It was a distinctly odd feeling, but one that I found I liked whilst feeling I was being naughty. I will warn faint-hearted readers or those that are a bit sensitive/squeamish: that very detailed heart illustration on the front cover is not the most gruesome thing about this book. There is violence and a lot of explicitly detailed sex scenes. Despite getting a YA vibe from the book, I still feel like there was a fair amount of adult content in this one. Young's world-building was exquisitely intricate also and it made me whoop for joy! This lady has clearly done her homework! There were a lot of references to The Book Of Enoch & Jewish Mythology (fans of Supernatural will certainly recognise a lot of names in this one). There were instances in which this book disappointed me however. The characterisation didn't feel entirely right at times: Zachariah's personality was a little lacklustre, and his decision making felt very off. The plot itself too began to unravel for me about two thirds in. By the end, I had so many unanswered questions, and things just seemed resolve a little too easily and in a slightly confusing manner. I'm not sure if Young plans to expand this into a series, but I would be interested to read more and see if my continued curiosity would be satisfied that way.

I admit I started reading this book with some suspicion: having done some indigestion of Anne Rice books, I finally stopped reading stories about vampires. Except that this is not a book about vampires, but on creatures much more interesting, namely the fallen angels and their offspring, half-human. Starting from the legend that angels exiled from Paradise still drag their immortal lives, waiting in despair the day of judgment, when their souls end up in hell, the fine book by Katie Young tells a story of love and betrayal, passion and hate, but mostly envy of the angels against us mortals, that envy is the original sin that caused the fall. And that envy is apparently unquenchable, as this sentiment undermines the moral firmness of the Archangel Uriel, who to destroy humanity give rise to a series of terrible events that can trigger the Last Judgement.

When I first read the blurb for this, two things instantly caught my eye — the fact the MC, Zach, has had his heart cut out, and the obvious allusions to vampires. But the premise is actually quite a bit more fascinating, combining the mythology behind angels and vampires into something altogether new. I will admit that I find the cover design a bit repulsive, but since the story does contain graphic violence and sex, it's a good representation of what readers should expect. This is most definitely not a story about angels in the traditional sense, but it is intriguingly refreshing.

None of the characters are clearly good or evil, and the four arch-angels (the Watchers) are far from the pristine creatures you'd normally see. Instead, they're much more reminiscent of The Authority in True Blood, or The Volturi in Stephenie Meyers's Twilight Saga. The history of their fall from grace was one of the better aspects of the story for me, and it was clear the author had done a lot of research into angel mythology. But I did feel that the fast pace of the story sort of prevented me from ever really connecting to any of the characters. It's told from a distanced, third person omniscient point-of-view, and I found the shifts between the characters to be jarring. Many of them are short, barely a full page, which created a sort of whip-lash effect as I was thrown from one person's head to another. The graphics used to separate the scene breaks often overpowered the text itself, and only further emphasized that disconnect.

I would have liked to see the story expanded a bit more, delving deeper into the characters, rather than sitting on the surface. That said, the fast pace will send you through a whirlwind of action, with plenty of twists and turns to keep you guessing. So while I was perhaps a little disappointed that it wasn't a more immersive experience, I do recommend this series and will most definitely be checking out more books by Ms. Young in the future.

When I started reading this book, I wasn't completely sure what to think about it. This was another book that took me a little while to get into... but once my suspension of disbelief was properly activated, I found myself getting properly into the book.

Angels and the themes of vampirism are both plots that, in my opinion, have become quite over-used. And vampires were over-used even before they started sparkling.

That having been said... I did find the storyline to be quite entertaining and the plot to be one that held my attention throughout.

I was a bit surprised at how much graphic sex (and violence) there was in this book. It's not something I actually have a problem with, but I had thought this would be a bit tamer, since it seems to be a young adult book.

I thought that the revelations in this book were shown in quite a good way. It was better than having the long, multi-paragraph exposition that I've seen used so much.

I couldn't say that there was any one character I liked more than the others. None of them really fit in with the regular 'good' or 'evil' affiliations.
