This was a very good read, and was written from a Polish point of view like all of his books. An archaeologist has the opportunity to recover an ancient war tank, and the memory unit from the tank. It was very well preserved due to the extreme cold it was found in, and suffered little if any battle damage. While waiting for repair parts for his space ship, he puts the memory module in a modern format that can be viewed by the public at the museum where he works. On his return he displays the tape to his supervisor, and this shows us the story of a young man condemned to become one with a tank with a mind, or be destroyed and recycled for food to support his people. Of course he chooses the tank, and has some wonderful adventures. If you like unusual war stories you will love this one. Very little blood and guts, mostly just the thinking and attempting to deal with an intelligent machine that has a will of its own, and follows orders unless you can convince it otherwise. A very worthwhile book to read.
