This lovely, sweet novel covers so many issues, such as being barren, romantic relationships beginning as lifelong friends, and the Amish rule of teachers being unmarried. Lillian teaches and doesn't ever want to give up what is more than a job to her. Lillian loves children and longs to have them, but she can't and never will. Timothy wants a wife and large family. Timothy wants his Amish wife to remain at home to raise their large brood of children as all Amish mothers do. Lillian and Timothy have been friends since they were very young and now, they find themselves falling in love. How can these two ever form a lasting relationship when their plans and desires differ so completely?

This is a really sweet novel. I immediately felt a positive vibe from Lillian and Timothy. They were such loving, caring young people. Their loyalty to their families was admirable. Their loyalty to their Amish faith almost tears them apart. I greatly admire the Amish but I don't agree with many of their practices. I was a mother of three and wife and taught school for many years. So I don't agree with not allowing married women to teach, although I did remain home with all of mine until my youngest was four. I can imagine it being difficult with a baby or two or three at a time as the Amish do. But the Amish are so close-knit that family members always help each other out. They wouldn't have the expense of a child-care giver. I also wanted a large family like Timothy and Lillian. But, through no fault of her own, Lillian is unable to bear children. I would also have felt devastated to be unable to have children, but fostering or adopting children would have been a wonderful option for my husband and I. We even discussed it in case we found we weren't able to reproduce our own children. So it is not hard for me to imagine the heartache an Amish couple would feel since large families are almost expected among them. They feel that children are a blessing from God. But I have never experienced it, so I know that I do not know the full despair that many barren women feel.

I really liked this story of Lillian and Timothy.

They have been friends forever and they didn't see each other as anything but friends. Until Lillian and her students were in danger at their school, due to a fire set by an arsonist and Timothy was a volunteer fireman for their Amish community. After the danger had passed, their first thoughts were of each other's safety and they realized they both wanted to be more than friends. Timothy was scared to jeopardize their friendship by saying something if she didn't feel the same way (even though his brothers and sisters-in-law assured him that she did) and although Lillian did feel the same way, she was not wanting to ruin his future because she was unable to give him the family that he desired.

This is a tale of well-developed characters in a well-rounded community, set in a series about this Amish townland. A young woman is teaching, cherishing other people's kids because she can have none of her own. But a young man, not knowing the truth, would like to marry her. If she marries she will have to give up teaching school, as the Amish reserve this job for unmarried young women.

In His Amish Teacher, we join Lillian Keim and Timothy Bowman of Bowman's Crossing as they start the treacherous journey from friendship to love. Lillian loves her job teaching more than anything especially since she knows she can never have children of her own due to an illness. Timothy and Lillian have been the best of friends for as long as anyone can remember and their friendship even survived a 6 year separation when Lillian's family moved to Wisconsin. Timothy feels the underlying fire of love for Lillian but is afraid of ruining their friendship. He decides to take a chance after an uncontrolled fire almost burned the school down with Lillian and 42 of the community's children inside. As Timothy works to put out the fires that are popping up around the community, will he smolder the flames of love for Lillian or let them be set ablaze?

I am a firm believer that if you and your love are friends first you have the best chance of having a forever love. Lillian and Timothy have shared just about everything life has to offer except marriage. They both have a love of learning, books and reading. They both share love of family and community.
