Not especially useful for an English speaker. The English instruction and explanation is often clumsy, stilted, insufficient, or incorrect - for example, the instruction that years in Polish ought to be given as cardinal numbers, when the examples clearly indicate ordinal numbers. Many of the exercises do not come with sufficient instruction, or the instructions are confusing, and quite a lot of the exercises are geared toward fact memorization rather than language learning.

What I found strangest, though, was the lack of a pronunciation guide, given that this is supposed to be for English speakers, and the pronunciation conventions are so vastly different.

The charts, tables, and illustrations are nice references, and the side-by-side translation would make it possible for a truly gifted linguist to work out much of the language independently, but as far as actual language learning goes, I did not find this much more useful than my illustrated Polish-English dictionary.
