Zane's Inferno is a story about two firemen. Well a fireman and a paramedic actually. This is a story about Zane, a fire fighter, and Nick, a paramedic, who work together and have been friends for a while. They're pretty much already in lust with each other before they admit there may be more. Lust carries these guys pretty far, and they are extremely hot when they get going.

Zane may not have liked rough play before, but when Nick introduces him to it, he can't get enough. Nick has always been extremely dominant, but with Zane he is ready to try loving and tender - once in a while. As they learn to stick together and trust each other, though, it becomes clear that not everyone wants them to stay together. Ferreting out the culprit takes a while, which enables them to see where things will lead. The constant danger they are in as they do their jobs probably makes them more sensitive to the fact they may lose each other. The animosity against gay men in their Texas town also helps to push them more closely together and they realize what they have may be love very early on.

If you like men who play a little rough, if firemen and paramedics are your thing, and if you're looking for a fun, light read with a bit of mystery, you may like this book.
