The author, Drew Lindsay, creates and tackles a large body of work, with a many-armed, quite detailed plot. At times, the protagonist, Ben Wood, feels larger than life and I half-expected him to start flying into the air while re-routing hurricanes and seeing bullets bounce off his body, all the while making love with every available female within a one hundred mile radius.

That said, the secondary characters are more down-to-earth and much more believable, with foibles and faults. There is young Binda, the aboriginal-descent detective with Maruce, the hard-bitten detective with a soft spot, the down-to-earth coroner/doctor, Ruth, who tends to everyone's body and soul, and Merinda, the

also aboriginal-descent rags-to-riches maven, whose husband disappeared in a plane somewhere. Now her business partner, was her husbands business parter...see where this is going?

Now add in a much-revered, spooky, religious Mountain in Austrailia and superstitions with bodies piling up. The story kept my attention, it didn't deviate much from the mail storyline and wrapped up nicely.

Overall, I would suggest Black Mountain Affair for a good weekend read.

“Black Mountain Affair” is a riveting, fascinating, mystery set in Far Northern Australia, in a territory once inhabited only by Aborigines, later settled by whites in what was often a bloody and violent confrontation. At sacred Black Mountain, where the fauna is often dangerous, including carnivorous “ghost bats,” two Aboriginal women-mother and daughter-are discovered, brutally murdered, in a cave. Next one of the investigating police detectives is killed while at the residence of a potential suspect. The brutal deaths don’t end here. Out there somewhere is a serial killer with a vengeance, and a hidden agenda the police cannot unravel.

The multicultural foundation of this novel is fascinating, and the author interweaves the socioeconomic conflicts between the native Aborigines and the Caucasian culture.

This is a true page-turner; this reviewer could not set it aside. The author’s perception of the multicultural, socioeconomic, caste, and historical layers of this region of Australia would be worth reading. In addition, Drew Lindsay weaves a taut and complelling, multilayered, and very complex mystery which keeps us guessing throughout.

The main issue with this book was the editing. There were many issues with verb tense and some typos too. Sadly, they were jarring enough that they distracted from the overall experience.

This one was chosen as part of a winter 'dark tales' Aussie group read, although it could also have been chosen for the subsequent 'select a book by its cover' challenge, since this (along with being Australian and free on iBooks) was the basis for my choice. The story is set in north queensland and follows the heroic actions of Ben Hood, whose previous ventures were part of a previous story I'd not read. Although the actions of the serial killer are as dark as the cover implies, the overall atmosphere of thie book is relatively light, with elements of Cussler-esque humour and romance. The story works fairly well and there are not many grammatical distractions (the difference between a loser and a looser was consistently and incorrectly missed). The resolution was not strongly telegraphed, but did not feel particularly gripping and finishes without much flourish. Not a waste of time but I don't feel much inclination to read the others in the series.
