Ross's ink drawings perfectly capture the charm of Little Wolf as he struggles to be bad enough to come home. Whybrow's text is full of great real, and imagined, vocabulary.

This is one of the funniest, most irreverent and charming stories I've read. Kids will adore the humorous reversals of a world where parents want their cub to be bad. Little Wolf's resourceful and mischievous responses to his adventure are perfectly complimented by Ross's illustrations. Kids drawn to fractured fairytales, Captain Underpants and illustrated fiction will eat this up.

A great supplement to a unit on fairy tales and perfect for fans of irreverent humor such as the Captain Underpants series by Dave Pilkey.
