The premise of the story was good but could have been better executed. Despite being not all that far from

nuclear detonations the main characters (in different locales) were not terribly worried about the drift of fallout and neither was anyone else. Luke is a former Navy SEAL but constantly loses situational awareness as well as not keeping a weapon handy and his mishaps border on nearly unbelievable. Liz, a potentially strong female, does very little to engage her children in what it will take to survive and is partially accountable for their misbehavior. Sierra is just too immature and dangerous to be credible. Still, it is not written badly and there is a lot of action so I might read the next one just to see if it improves.
