The good thing about that last book, though, was it was very coherent, it was all about one thing: death.

This book skips around a lot and that's the worst part of it. There are a few photos from her family, a few of flowers, there are snippets from previous sequences, some just focusing on body parts, some are landscapes and you can tell that they're just small samplings of her work.

But, really, that's my only complaint. Her abilities are pretty vast and you get a good idea from this book, even if it's only a taste. I listed all these subjects above and she hits it out of the park in all of them.

On one end of the spectrum, you see her playing around with pure form in photos of flowers floating around in puddles. They're just kind stunning, you have to see them. They're those kind of "Is it a painting or a photograph?" kind of pictures.

Then on the other end, you have the pictures of her children, which are stunning because of their content (I mean, they're pretty, too, don't get me wrong). She's gotten a lot of flak for portraying her own children nude and in an "adult" way, but it's kind of refreshing not to see non-Disneyfied children, puffing on candy cigarettes, wetting the bed, wiping their bloody noses and glaring at the camera aggressively.
