Of all the menage stories I've come across, this would have to be the most realistic premise. A sickly "elderly" Lord (he's only 42, but has a degenerative disease) and his (young) Scottish Lady had married for love. But after trying to conceive for months, the Lord, Edgar, realizes that his condition is hereditary. Afraid that his offspring would suffer his fate but still needing an heir to prevent his vile nephew from inheriting, he decides that there should be a surrogate sperm donor and someone to take care of Emily when he died. Enters Angus, the indentured servant Groom, who was once a Laird. Angus had fallen in love with Emily through stories of her from Emily's father, but seeing her married kinda pisses him off. Angus and Emily start with a volatile relationship, but the three eventually develop an arrangement.

I would have enjoyed this book more if the writing was more sophisticated. While the sex scenes were different and well-written, the emotion and character development could use more...umph. Actually, the emotions were there, deep and complicated, but the writing was too simplistic to express them properly.

Overall, I honestly enjoyed it. Not exactly for a titillating read, but it brings about a new type of story to the historical erotica genre.

I'm not usually a big fan of menage stories for anything more than a dirty diversion. But *Anchor and Storm* is more than just a sexy romp. It's a love story. --I know, I know, I've seen the cover too. But I promise, there is more to this book than meets the eye.

Emily was governess to Edgar's nephew's children when he met her. Even though he was older and in poor health, the two of them fell for each other and married. To an outsider, it may have looked like Em married him for his money and title, but her love for him was very real.

Edgar quickly realizes that he needs to get Emily pregnant. An heir would secure her future in the event of his death. But conception proves to be elusive. Soon, Edgar determines that the illness wasting his legs is a genetic one. He refuses to pass the illness on to a child, but he desperately wants Emily to have a baby. Enter Angus. He is the Highland horse groom of Edgar's household. He's crazy for Emily, and though the feeling is

mutual, she is fiercely loyal to her husband. She figures it's an attraction she will never act on, until Edgar makes a bold suggestion: let Angus get her pregnant to provide the needed heir.

Like I said before, this really is a love story. Edgar and Emily love each other deeply and completely. It's also clear that Angus and Emily grow to love each other as well. But it's all laid out in a way that I never felt Em betrayed her husband for even a moment. When the book progresses to a point that they're all in bed together, it was far more believable than the premise for many m/f/m's that I have read. There's some steamy sex, but nothing over the top or really dirty. There is no m/m vibe at all... just two men, who hold a mutual respect for one another, head over heels in love with same woman. 4 1/2 stars.

WOW. I wasn't expecting to be so blown away by this read, but I was. The cover of the book is entirely misleading. Don't get me wrong, it's definitely hot, but there is so much more to it than just the sex in *Anchor and Storm*.

Edgar Armstrong is dying of a wasting disease and although he has found a loving wife in Emily, they wish to start a family before Edgar's health declines even more. But when Edgar realizes his disease can be passed down to his young, he refuses to be the one to give Emily a child. Instead, he proposes that she take a lover.

They don't have much time to wait because Edgar's nephew, Raymond and his bitch wife Caroline are trying to steal Edgar's title away from him so it is imperative that Edgar produces an heir before he dies. After attempts on both his life and Emily's, Edgar believes having a surrogate child would be best.

But the question is, who will Emily choose to take as a lover?

Angus works for Edgar and they get along fine, but when Angus develops a deep love for his boss' wife, Angus finds himself in a difficult spot. Emily and Angus fight their feelings for one another, but even Edgar can see the sparks between them. Soon, a deep bond forms between the three and I was surprised to find myself loving all three characters equally. Edgar is confident in his love for Emily and her love in him while Emily is capable of so much love that she can find true love in two different men, and Angus is so devoted to Emily that he would do anything to ensure her happiness.
