She's like Tohru from **Fruits Basket**. Happy-go-luck and never down, yet wants to help others and never gives up. And I can't help but like this.

I finally found a Manga series I like! Najika's parents died when she was young, and she now lives at Lavender House, a home for orphans. Not long after their deaths, she was comforted by a boy who gave her flan. The spoon he left behind is the only clue she has to her "Flan Prince" but she is determined to find him and make him the best dessert in the world. She traces the spoon to Seika Academy in Tokyo, where she earns admittance in the 7th grade based on her enormous cooking talent. At the academy she becomes friends with 2 brothers, the sons of the Director. Could one of them be her Flan Prince? Each chapter has a particular food that Najika cooks, and there are recipes at the end of each book. I like this better than other Manga I've read for several reasons: there aren't that many characters so it is possible to keep them straight; the plot is relatively simple; and I can generally tell which characters are male and which are female. And, of course, it's food fiction! (Review is pretty much for the whole series)
