Hi goodreads audience and, if I can get her attention, Ms. Tashelby Robinson herself. First, I want to explain the rating in a general sense, because I don't want you to think that I find this to be a bad book/photobook. I find it enlightening and at times beautiful, but there are things that I would change; things that are important enough to affect the rating I will eventually give it on my scale.

SUMMARY:

Ms. Robinson put together a short photo book centered on Miami's more botanical lens than, say, what rapper Pitbull would talk about. Most of the pictures in this book are clear and beautiful. There are words in this book that describe an inception of a new look on life. I totally love this idea and it is somewhat conveyed in the pages of this book.

REVIEW:

First, I want to talk about words. I really wished the Ms. Robinson had utilized the combination of short prose and pictures to make the meaning behind her short book even more clear. Besides the first page entitled "Refresher," which has 153 words, the titles of each section, and the author bio, there are forty-two words. I found myself wanting to know what plants I was being shown or what buildings were there. The history and the current state of things would've been a great thing for the author to show in this book. This one, I feel bad about, because we all make spelling and grammar errors; unfortunately when you publish a book, even self-publishing, you have to make sure everything is air-tight. Don't feel too bad about this one Ms. Robinson, because I've seen errors in books from BIG TIME publishers. One sentence that is featured as one of the forty-two words goes like this:

"I'm just stepping in to give a special thanks to all who has gotten this far!"

Just a quick fix of changing that "has" to a "have" and everything is great. Unless the intention is to put this as for one person, but the word "all" makes that unlikely.

So, other than one grammar error, the lack of more prose, and descriptions of photos, the book was relatively good. I'd say that it deserves B- in my grading scale. I did the book and I might see what part two is going to be like, but I hope she's able to get some things fixed. I also wonder if this would make a good children's book. Basically, teaching them to love themselves, find beauty and teachings in nature, and maybe a little more. That's just off the top of my head.
