The Solus series just keeps getting better and better. *Wings of Nestor* is my favorite installment so far.

One of the strengths of the books is the settings and *Nestor* is no different. Here, we're taken to imagery-rich places like Lomay's secret invisible mansion off the coast, the Tavean palace, the underground tunnel where the Wings of Nestor are, a secret hideout underneath a lake, and my favorite, Toopai, the dragon island, which is so beautifully written. This world is so creatively written and explored and I can immediately see all of them in my mind.

Characters are becoming more complex, more involved and more real in the story. The main characters are growing and changing and going through their own character arcs. Alcandar is more fully explored in this novel and given a rich backstory and a great motive for being involved. Emane is tempered out quite a bit and Kiora is becoming a stronger heroine, but without completely losing the empathy that makes her her own unique person in the series. *Nestor* is one of my favorites in the series because we're seeing the characters and their relationships with each other grow and change in natural ways. Things don't feel as forced anymore.

The action sequences are great, particularly anything with Jasmine involved and especially the palace fight and climax at the end. The plot is getting more complex. There are more twists and turns and it's allowing for each character to get involved and have a more personal stake in the fight other than "because evil has to be destroyed." Jasmine is a much better villain than Dralazar and is a much more formidable opponent to Kiora.

There were still a few typos and formatting errors here and there, but it's not distracting. The Solus series started off on the generic side of a young-adult fantasy, but has quickly grown into its own, with its own rich universe and mythology and a complicated and intriguing plot and backstory. I can't wait to see how the series finishes.

Unbelievable! I thoroughly enjoyed the first two installments to the Solus series, but the third out shines them in every aspect. Wings of Tavea is perhaps my favorite in the series. They are all so amazing that choosing one is nearly impossible.

The revelations are remarkable! I literally had to stay up the entire night for this one. The connections from Wings of Arian to this novel are ingenious! I am baffled by the skill and imagination that concocted every sentence of this series as a whole. I am always impressed at a well-written and well-structured novel, but to earn my praise the prose has to be something magnificent!

Emane is subtly written into the background, yet maintaining a prominent role in the story. There are chapters via his POV concerning his relationship with Kiora that shatter my heart. His role in the installment

leaves no reader room to doubt loving this character.

Alcander and Kiora are strengthening the bond with one another. I am extremely eager to find out where this is headed. The scenes are anything but disappointing.

If you've read the first two books you've seen thought Dralazar to be an ultimate evil. His presence is easily overshadowed and the next villain in line downplays his heinous deeds to mere games. The heart of evil is truly chilling and the losses are great.

In past reviews I've left out other prominent characters, such as Drustran the shifter, Arturo the Pegasus, and the ancient's, Lomay being one presented in this book and the next. Drustran is always prepared with quick witted quips leaving me to smile or laugh. Arturo is the same while offering much needed wisdom and a firmness Kiora needs to handle attain a firmer grasp in her weighted role. Lomay sometimes feels like a mystery and is no less endearing than the rest of this dynamic group.

The mysteries abound, strength is gained from breaking and rebuilding, and much of this story left me shocked. *The Wings of Nestor* is inexplicably better than the prior two novels in the series. I am already holding my breath and anxious before even starting the next novel.

In *Wings of Nestor*, the stakes are even higher for Kiora as she tries to fight the evil that is the Shadow. While she has defeated one evil, this one is proving to be an even tougher challenge. Kiora must hone her magical abilities, as well as learn to fight in the absence of magic. Being the prophesized savior is certainly taking its toll on her, and I enjoyed watching Kiora grow even as she goes through some rough patches to do so. Thankfully, she's not alone. All of our favorite characters from the previous books are back in action and a few new ones are introduced as Kiora changes paths to reach her destiny.

I really want to talk about the love triangle, so that's what we're going to do first. I enjoyed it in the previous book, but I really enjoyed it in *Wings of Nestor*. I even switched teams! I wasn't so sure about Kiora's bond with Alcander, but now I'm totally into it! Not just because Alcander is super hot (I mean, look at that cover!), but because we get to know him a lot better and I just like how he is with her. Of course, Emanuele is still around, but a lot of the time I felt like he was more concerned with "beating" Alcander than with Kiora's feelings. They do have some sweet and emotional scenes together though. I also love the dynamic between Alcander and Emanuele. It's different than other triangles and it makes it much more believable. Yes, they're in love with the same girl and are kind of adversaries, but they also need to work together to help Kiora with her mission. Sabotage is not an option without hurting her, too. There's also an interesting reveal that I'm curious to see how/if it plays out in *Wings of Lomay*!

Wings of Nestor improves and builds upon everything from the previous two books. I've already mentioned there's more romance, and the love triangle is amazingly written. There's also a lot more magic and action! I've absolutely loved learning about the magic in this world and watching Kiora continue to grow into her powers. She's really pushed to her limits this time, and we get to see some new and wild spells in action. There are also more magical species introduced which is always fun. My favorite was probably seeing the

This is a challenging review for me to write for several reasons. The first is because I loved the first two books in the series so much and the second is because I'm struggling to find the words to describe this book and my feelings towards it. As some of you may know from my reviews on the first two books in this series, Walls has managed to create a series that is rich in visual images, enjoyable characters, and leaves you wanting more long after the story is done. But unlike the previous two books which blew me away, this one was harder for me to get into and it didn't seem like the connection between events was as solid as it had been in the previous novels.

Now before I continue, I would like to state that once again if you've not read *Wings of Arian* and *Wings of Tavea*, please make it a point to do so before you read this book. Just as the events in *Wings of Tavea* took place directly after the events in book one, so do events in this book take place after the events in book two. There is very little down time between stories, so don't think that you can just pick up somewhere in the middle and understand what is taking place. This is not that type of series. And while Walls does do some backstory retelling, it's not nearly enough to give a new comer to the series a full understanding of what is going on.

Having said that, while I still enjoyed this book, it took me longer to get caught up in what was happening and there were several moments where I felt like I was missing important details, even though I had read the other books in the series. I guess the advantage I had the first time around was that I was able to read books one and two back-to-back. And maybe, if I'm to be honest, I simply just wasn't feeling this story at first as I

did the others. I don't know. It's safe to say though that the further into the book I read, the more interested in the story I became, I just hate that it took nearly half the book for me to get into it though. =^-.^=

Aside from that, I still think that Kiora is turning out to be a great character. She's certainly grown a lot since the events in the previous two books, and while her indecision between her emotions for Emene and Alcander got under my fur, mostly because I really dislike love triangles, I can't help but feel as though she's more than proven she's meant to fulfill the prophecy of the Solus and that she'll find a way to avoid war. And if she doesn't, it's certainly not for lack of trying. It was fun to watch Emene come into his own this time around. Now that he's found his place in the group and settled fully into his role, he's not nearly as aggravating as he was, though again I could do without his constantly getting into a hissing match with Alcander. And speaking of Alcander, whereas with book two I wasn't entirely sure I liked him all that much, I've come to have more respect for him in this novel. At the very least I understand him a whole lot more. All three of them have gone through so much...it's hard not to feel for them all at this point.

As for Walls's writing, as I said, it is still just as rich in imagery and power as in her previous novels. I greatly enjoyed her description of the island of Toopai and it was definitely my favorite part out of the entire book.
