Haiky? Volume 3: Go, Team Karasuno picks up where we left off, just meeting Nishinoya, the team's Libero! Unfortunately, his return isn't set in stone, as one other important team member has refused to return, leading Nishinoya to refuse to come back until the other player does. Then it's the road to an all out battle between Crows and Cats in what was once known as The Dumpster Battle! Let's break it down.

Yu Nishinoya and Asahi Azumane are definitely the main focus of this volume, and that was a refreshing change. First we finally get to know a little more about Noya as the Libero, and then, we get to learn about Asahi, the missing teammate who Noya refuses to play without. Asahi is one of Karasuno's Wing Spiker's and is also the Ace - the star player and the one everyone relies on when things go south. After a game against another school, one where Asahi believes he failed his team because he wasn't able to get the balls Suga set through the blockers even though Noya kept saving the balls and getting them back into air for the team to keep fighting. This is a difficult situation for these 3 especially, nonetheless the rest of the team. Getting shut out like that is a major morale killer for a player, so it's easy to see how Asahi would have fallen into a rut and gotten frustrated with the others for not being as upset with him as he was himself. Noya also thought he was the failure, and Suga thought the same of himself. These three boys were all about blaming themselves rather than each other and it made the team fall apart during a rather explosive argument.

Karasuno vs Municipal Team was exactly what they all needed to find their footing again. Somehow Noya and Asahi get swept up into the game without meaning, too, and some wise words from Hinata get Asahi thinking about what it is he really loves about Volleyball. Seeing the two be able to get over what happened and get back in line as players was a great experience. Finally, the team is complete once again.

Keishin Ukai is looking like he's going to be our new coach, the grandson of the former coach who was on the team about seven years before. And it almost looks like he knows who the Little Giant is. I look forward to that reveal one day. The entire plot of Takeda-sensei trying to recruit Ukai as the coach was hilarious -

especially when he kept creepily popping up everywhere scaring the daylight out of Ukai.

Nekoma Vs Karasuno: The Dumpster Battle sounds like a hell of a lot of fun. The fact that these two schools used to be so close in the old days but grew apart is pretty sad to think about, because think of all the inter-high friendships that could have kept growing from that tradition. It's great of Takeda-sensei to try and bring it back - and even better that this game is what brought Ukai into the fold as he remembers his glory days. We get a brief glimpse of two of the Nekoma players at the end: quite and gaming obsessed Kenma Kozume who plays as the setter and the Captain, Tetsuro Kuroo who has one hell of a case of bedhead.

This one slowed down a bit more and had a bit heavier plot line in it, and while this didn't detract from the story, I did feel it dragged a bit in some places. 3.5 stars out of 5!

The book I read is the 3rd book of the Shonen Jump manga, Haikyu!!. Haikyu!! is the story of two rivals in the aspect of volleyball, Hinata Shoyo and Kageyama Tobio, coincidentally end up attending the same high school, Karasuno High School which is located in Japan, and must come together as they are now allies on the school's volleyball club. As from previous years, the volleyball club has been called the "fallen crows" due to the fact that their team has progressively gotten worse and that they are losing their connections to other clubs around team. It is now the team's job to regain their title and reign supreme.

In this book, we meet Nishinoya Yuu, the team's energetic and quirky libero. As the newcomers meet Nishinoya, Hinata asks him about the team's ace, the star player of the court that Hinata aspires to be one day. In a fit of rage, Nishinoya stormed out of the building, threatening that he wouldn't come back to the team if the ace didn't come back. We do, however, find out that there was a fallout between the ace and Nishinoya. After tensions dropped, multiple members tried to convince the ace, Asahi Azumane, to rejoin the team, but he declined the offer. One problem with the team is that they lack of a coach, and only have a

adviser, Ittetsu Takeda. Fortunately, Ittetsu was able to convince Keishin Ukai, the grandson of the former volleyball club coach that managed to take the club to nationals, to become the new coach of the volleyball club. After managing to find a new coach, Ittetsu scheduled a practice match between the club and the alumni members. Curiosity peaked Asahi, and he ended up trying to peep into the gymnasium where the practice match was held. After being caught by the team captain, Daichi Sawamura, he was dragged into the practice match.

I really enjoy the book for many reasons. First, reading manga really helps spread your diversity. Manga originated from Japan and has a different style. For example, we read books from left to right, but in manga, we read from right to left. Another example is that in Japan, suffixes are added to people's name, depending on your relation with the person. In literature, we tend to focus more of English, modern, and classic literature and never try to expand our knowledge past what we are taught. Reading foreign literature, like manga, can be an eye-opener to the many cultures around the world. Second, this series may relate to many teens since the story is based around high schoolers. This may serve as a source for life lessons. For example, one moral of the story is that even though you may have a grudge against someone, working together can do wonders, may better both of you mentally and socially, and can help build a better relationship.

If I would recommend this book to someone, I would recommend it to any teens. Around this time in a teens life, chances are that there will be problems that they have with people. I believe that this could show people that not fighting or holding grudges against people can do wonders. This can show that fighting is never the answer and that we should come together to deal with our problem. I feel that this could motivate teens into trying to start over with people that they have wronged or have wronged them. Also, as I stated before, this could be an eye-opener to culture and diversity to some teens. We as a society tend to never open up to new possibilities, ideas, or beliefs. If we open up to these, I believe that we could all be well-rounded people. Also, parts of the manga are very humorous and may draw attention towards teens. Though I do recommend this specifically towards teens, I believe that anyone who is wanting to try something new should read this manga.

Haikyuu!!, Vol. 3 continues where the previous tank?bon left off and contains the next nine chapters (17–25) of the on-going manga series and a bonus story: What Really Happened to the T-shirts.

Most of the tank?bon has Karasuno High School recruiting, or rather re-recruiting former members back on the team. The first person they tried to re-recruit is Y? Nishinoya, who was the team's libero. A libero is a player who specialized in defensive skills and Y? Nishinoya was one of the best – a prodigy of sorts who was nicknamed the "Karasuno's Guardian Deity".

However, since Asahi Azumane has not returned to the team – he was not either. Apparently, Y? Nisinoya has a similar relationship with Asahi Azumane as Sh?y? Hinata has with Tobio Kageyama. Thanks to Sh?y? Hinata, Y? Nisinoya did stay a while to teach him how to block. It is also thanks to Sh?y? Hinata that they met Asahi Azumane, because he always dreams of being the Ace of the team and Asahi Azumane is considered the ace of the team – so they had to meet.

Asahi Azumane is a third-year student at Karasuno High School and a wing spiker in the volleyball club. He is considered the team's ace. Despite his large physique, spiking power, and mature demeanour, he is very timid and has a glass heart. He quit the team, because he felt the pressure of the team on his shoulders and that he lost rather badly. Sh?y? Hinata with Tobio Kageyama meets with him several times, trying to convince him to return to the team.

Meanwhile, Ittetsu Takeda, the faculty adviser, tried to convince Keishin Ukai, an alumnus of Karasuno High School, and was once a part of the volleyball team, to become the technical coach. He is the grandson of the previous coach and a member of Karasuno Neighborhood Association. He keeps declining the offer, but Ittetsu Takeda is insistent.

Once again, Ittetsu Takeda had made another coup that changed everything. He has secured another practice game against Nekoma High School on the last day of Spring Break. In Japanese, Neko means cat and Karasu means crow, so when there was a game between both schools their match was often referred to as the "Battle by the Garbage Dump" or "Cat vs. Crow". In the past, they were considered old rivals, but since Karasuno High School Volleyball Team has declined, they have not played each other much.

When Asahi Azumane and Keishin Ukai heard that they were playing Nekoma High School again, it brought back memories for them. It was the game against Nekoma High School that Asahi Azumane lost his confidence, which led him to quit the team and now he wants to play to rectify what was done. As for Keishin Ukai, when he heard that Nekoma High School had a new coach that was in the same year as him, he just knew that it was his rival. Therefore, he agreed to be the coach until the end of their practice match against Nekoma High School.

One of his first things he did, as coach was to set up a game between Karasuno High School and the Neighborhood Association Team. Since they were missing players, K?shi Sugawara, the vice-captain, Asahi Azumane, and Y? Nishinoya joined the Neighborhood Association Team, while the played against the rest of the Karasuno High School Team. Despite losing in two straight sets (25|1|19) and (25|2|18), Sh?y? Hinata learned very much about himself and embraced his position as team's decoy. He also tells Asahi Azumane that he sees a path where he could get to his dream as Ace through being the team's decoy. The rest of the tank?bon has the team training and we are introduced to a couple of team members from the Nekoma High School.

Haruichi Furudate has written and illustrated this tank?bon. For the most part, I really liked the story. It was mainly a transitional tank?bon and it is great to learn and read about more characters of the Karasuno High School Volleyball Team. Y? Nishinoya has become one of my favorite characters. He has a very energetic personality and is ridiculously strong-hearted. He tends to be carried away because he has so much passion and intensity.

All in all, *Haikyuu!!*, Vol. 3 is a wonderful continuation to a new series that seems really intriguing and I can't wait to read more.
